I love baseball. Since I grew up in the South, my favorite team is the Atlanta Braves. I have had the opportunity to watch Hank Aaron, Willie Mays, and many major league players play this great national pastime. I really enjoy watching the game in person and I've had the privilege to attend games in both the old and new stadiums in Atlanta and San Francisco, the old stadium in San Diego, Coors Field in Denver, Wrigley



Field in Chicago and Fenway Park in Boston. In March, Judy and I saw two games at spring training in Arizona. I am also coaching my two grandsons Trevor and Logan's Little League Team the Pirates with my son Ben. And I am looking forward to our baseball outing on May 19.

Now attending ballgames is not only fun for me, but it also gives me the opportunity to make some observations about life. So let me share some observations from the ballpark. So this got me to thinking – how many people are there who don't enjoy life and take full advantage of the price that Jesus Christ paid for all of us on the cross at Calvary – the forgiveness of our sins, the freedom from guilt and fear of death, mercy, grace, salvation and the promise of eternal life?

Now I'm a true fan, I don't want to miss one pitch; I even chart the game on a score card. But there are the casual fans that come to the game to just socialize and eat the hotdogs. And there's nothing wrong with that. But they miss so much – the home run, the double play, and the over the shoulder basket catch Willie Mays' style. In John 10:10, Jesus says "I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly." The *Message* puts it this way: "I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better than they ever dreamed of." In other words living life to the fullest in a personal relationship with the Lord as God originally intended: finding the meaning of life; having a joyful heart and the assurance of God's love; and finding that peace that passes all understanding. A little boy was memorizing John 3:16. He quoted what you would normally read in the fourth Gospel until he made a slight change. He said: "... whoever believes in Him should not perish, but shall live happily ever after." Not a bad paraphrase! How many of us as Christians fail to live the life that Christ has promised us because we fail to put Him first and get involved in the game?

I have a T-shirt that says "Life Begins with Baseball." Many die-hard baseball fans would agree with that statement, but to me life begins with Jesus Christ. Until you fully accept Him into your heart, and walk with Him each and every day, you are not truly living.

Back To The Cross

1 Peter 1:18-19, "Forasmuch as ye know that ye were not redeemed with corruptible things, as silver and gold, from your vain conversation received by tradition from your fathers; But with the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot..."

The old farmer and his family were fast asleep when the old grandfather clock struck thirteen times. This woke him, and he jumped up out of bed and shouted, "Everyone get up, it's later than it's ever been." We are in the last hours of our days on this earth. The hand of the clock is approaching the midnight hour, The Church is rapidly drifting into a state of apostasy, further and further away from God. Dark forces have been turned loose which are producing an evil effect upon the Church as upon the world. The Cross of Christ is the light that will illuminate the present darkness.

We need a fresh revelation of sin, for it is through sin that we have lost our way, and it is through Christ's death on the Cross that we are won back and restored to God. I Peter 3:18 says, "For Christ also hath once suffered for sins, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh, but quickened (made alive) by the Spirit:" The reason why many lose the sense of the sinfulness of sin is that they get away from the reality of Christ's atoning death, for it is only at the Cross that we get a vision of the depths and misery of sin.

Calvary is a revelation of man's hatred to God's authority—a hatred which manifested itself in the blackest, darkest deed ever committed. The Cross is the criterion of the human heart. It reveals man in his true character. The Church has lost sight of the Cross, and has therefore lost sight of the awfulness of sin. She has wandered from the place where sin is seen in God's light, and where the soul is led to cry out, "I have crucified my Lord." What astonishes one in these days is the sin in the Church. In the Book of Revelation, John was amazed when he saw the end

time church, drunk with the blood of the saints and with the blood of the martyrs of Jesus. (He said), "and when I saw her, I marveled with great amazement." John couldn't believe what he was seeing. Sometimes I feel just like John when I see what's going on in the church today.

How awful it is that Christians can sin and be unmoved by it! God's people are sinning—sinning in the heart, sinning in the mind, sinning in the pulpit, sinning in the pew,—sinning in spite of Calvary and all that the Bible reveals of the horror and degradation of sin. Let us go back to Calvary and let the Cross melt our hardness and cause the tears to flow!
