MAY SECOND MILE GIVING - Haven House

Haven House is the only domestic violence shelter in Sandoval County. It is an eight (8) bedroom shelter that provides temporary housing for thirty-two (32) victims and their children who are no longer able to stay in their

homes due to unsafe conditions. The location of the home is unknown except to law officials and those who offer assistance.

The services provided by Haven House include emergency shelter, case management, support groups, life-skill classes, legal advocacy, referral to job opportunities, housing, therapeutic counseling for both women and their children, and children's programs.



These custom kits contain a child-size fleece blanket, a handmade stuffed toy (A special thank you to Lisa Isenberger, Rose Meyer, Bonnie Korngiebel who sewed up all these treasures), and an assortment of child-size toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, face cloth, soap, et.al.). Our intention is to pass along a bit of warmth and a big hug! Ladies, come join us!

Women with Purpose has the great privilege of supporting the work of Rev. Chris Davis who pastors the Nazarene Compassionate Ministry Church in Gallup, NM. This last month we filled 100 hand made fabric bags, created by Sue Duranty, with non perishable food to be given to the folks on the Navajo Reservation. A Favorite Recipe! Toffee!

At our last meeting of Women with Purpose, several people requested the recipe for Jody Meyer's Toffee:

Step 1.) 14 oz Hershey's chocolate bar with almonds; plus 1 lb <u>slivered</u> almonds (NOT sliced with bark). Process in bottom blade of food processor to almost powder form. Divide evenly into 2 bowls and stir with whisk. Pour 1 of the bowls onto an 11x17 cookie sheet. Spread evenly using spatula (NOT hands.) Step 2.) 2 lbs salted butter & 2 cups sugar. Melt butter, add sugar, and boil the mixture (medium on gas stove or med/low on electric.) Once it starts boiling (about 10 min.) begin stirring <u>constantly</u> for about 20 minutes, until mixture turns creamy. (It will separate, turn light brown, then go back together.) STIR continuously! When mixture is caramel colored, pour QUICKLY onto the cookie sheet and smooth it rapidly with spatula. Evenly spread the remaining chocolate/almond mixture over the toffee and cover with wax paper. Press gently using a hot pad over the wax paper. Cool several hours (room temp, then in fridge). Break into pieces. (Jody uses a hammer and a sterilized flat-head screwdriver.) It will keep in the refrigerator for a year!!

The Health of High Desert Food Pantry

Even though we have seen many changes brought about by the Covid pandemic, this church and the food pantry remain as strong as ever in our commitment to provide food and basic necessities to those in need in our community.

During 2021, we experienced a significant drop in client participation – possibly due to a combination of pandemic fear, government subsidies, extended unemployment or just the weather. Our individuals served in 2020 was 4,682, comprised of seniors, adults, and children. Those numbers fell to 3,807 in 2021, yet showed an upswing as we neared 2022.

We have not yet reached pre-pandemic levels, but we are registering a few new clients each month and hope to see these participation numbers continue to grow as we move along in 2022.

As you may know, we receive the majority of our food products from Road Runner Food Bank, but there has been a remarkable drop in their offerings during the last half of 2021. Thankfully, we have acquired other "partners" in our search to subsidize those battling food insecurity.

In addition to the monthly contributions from our congregation, we have received additional food items from Mesa View and St. Stephen's United Methodist Churches, the New Covenant Worship Center, the Corrales Fire Department food drive, and others who recognize the importance of and the commitment to serving the Lord by helping to feed the hungry.

Our mission is stronger than ever and our success is determined by many factors – not the least of which is our volunteer staff. These "angels" are ready and willing to serve each day of distribution, whether we serve 70 families or 17. We strive to grow our client base as we move beyond the pandemic and hopefully return to some sense of normalcy.
