## FEED NEW MEXICO KIDS

Dear Friends at High Desert United Methodist Church,

Pastor Reuben is always saying, "We Methodists LOVE to eat!" While he speaks the truth, it is also true that <u>this</u> Methodist church loves to feed others. Many of our avenues of service and ministry ensure that food will get into the hands-and stomachs-of those who struggle to eat nutritious meals.

Let me remind you of some of our efforts. We operate a food pantry which provides groceries to local households. Mike Fawcett, John Samford and their team welcome clients three times a month. Our Community of Hope dinner, prepared and served by Dave and Sue Duranty, provides a warm Sunday respite to many who live on the streets. Joanne Landry of Interfaith Bible Center tells us that her folks look forward to the large quantities of food that we haul to her center once a month. (She tells us that the most requested meal is chili dogs with cheese! A trip through Costco yields over 300 hotdogs!) Rev Landry serves 100 meals a day for five days a week. We also provide Thanksgiving dinner to struggling families through Haven House, a safe house in Rio Rancho. We have a ministry of snack baskets led by Gloria Lamoreux and Dottie Hester which surprises hospital workers, police officers, fire fighters, and other community heroes with tasty treats. We are busy!

Not only do we reach beyond our walls to feed others, but when members of our congregation face health or life altering challenges, other members regularly step up to deliver a delicious meal to ease the burden. Yes, it's true we love to eat but we love to see to it that others have something to eat as well.

If you know me, you may wonder when I will shine the spotlight on the "food-centered" ministry of this church that is very close to my heart—Feed New Mexico Kids. As an educator, I devoted my life to teaching in public schools. It was hard to see children who struggled with learning in the classroom because they were not well fed. This program strives to address the needs of hungry students right here in our community. We started packing weekend food bags two years ago on a small scale but soon realized that the need was big. And the need was/is growing. Last month, September, we assembled and donated 263 bags of food to students in four different public schools and the local Boys and Girls Club. We will probably face more requests for food and will do our best to step up!

It is such a privilege to attend a church that truly cares about others. My prayer is that our congregation will continue to build a bigger table and invite those around us who are hungry to pull up a chair and eat with us.

Thank you for letting me serve with you.



As this teacher learned, some of the most moving lessons are taught by students.

When Mrs. Klein told her first graders to draw a picture of something for which they were thankful, she thought how little these children, who lived in a deteriorating neighborhood, actually had to be thankful for. She knew that most of the class would draw pictures of turkeys or of bountifully laden Thanksgiving tables. That was what they believed was expected of them.

What took Mrs. Klein aback was Douglas's picture. Douglas was so forlorn and likely to be found close in her shadow as they went outside for recess. Douglas's drawing was simply this:

A hand, obviously, but whose hand? The class was captivated by his image. "I think it must be the hand of God that brings us food," said one student.

"A farmer," said another, "because they grow the turkeys."

"It looks more like a policeman, and they protect us." "I think," said Lavinia, who was always so serious, "that it is supposed to be all the hands that help us, but Douglas could only draw one of them."

Mrs. Klein had almost forgotten Douglas in her pleasure at finding the class so responsive. When she had the others at work on another project, she bent over his desk and asked whose hand it was.

Douglas mumbled, "It's yours, Teacher."

Then Mrs. Klein recalled that she had taken Douglas by the hand from time to time; she often did that with the children. But that it should have meant so much to Douglas ...

Perhaps, she reflected, this was her Thanksgiving, and everybody's Thanksgiving—not the material things given unto us, but the small ways that we give something to others.
