Well, there are only a few weeks before Thanksgiving, when we as Americans set aside a day to be thankful for the many blessings of life. However, in reality, we should be thankful each and every day for the blessings that God bestows on us. So, let me focus on one of these blessings that God sends our way.

The other day, I was watching the movie The Book of Eli, and one of the closing scenes touched me. Thirty years after war turned the world into a wasteland, a lone warrior named Eli marches across the ruined landscape carrying hope for the redemption of humanity. He fights his way across America in order to protect a sacred book that holds the secret to saving human kind. Only one other man understands the power of the book Eli carries, and he is determined to take it for himself.

Near the end of the movie, Eli and Solara, who has joined his quest, arrive in the wasteland of what used to be San Francisco. They get into a rowboat and head for Alcatraz Island where a group is gathering remnants of prewar civilization such as books, music and art, and storing them in cells until they are ready to rebuild and re-establish society following a nuclear disaster. Eli tells them that he has a copy of the King James Bible.

Of course, they welcome Eli since he is in possession of the only known copy of the Bible. The curator of Alcatraz asks Eli if his copy is in good condition. To which Eli responds: "It's worn, but it still does the job." That line got to me. God gives us this precious gift of His Word as an instruction manual for living the Christian life. How many of us are using this gift as our daily compass through life? Is your Bible worn or do the pages still stick together like when it was new? Charles Spurgeon, the great British preacher, once said that a Bible that is falling apart usually belongs to someone who is not.

Another message from the movie is that we don't know how precious something is until we don't have it anymore. With all the blessings of life that we enjoy, we tend to overlook one of the greatest gifts that God has given us. We tend to take the Bible and its availability for

granted. Following the reading of the scripture during worship, you will often hear the person say: "God's Word for God's people; thanks be to God." But do we really mean it; are we truly thankful for this wonderful guide for life that God has given us. And more importantly, are we using it or is it gathering dust somewhere in our home?

As long as I can remember I have had a Bible in my hands. I have read it from cover to cover, but it is still a mystery to me; it still inspires me. I will never completely understand it because it is inspired by a far greater wisdom than me – the love of God. But that doesn't stop me from reading it every morning. I cannot get through a day without the Word of God; it is my security blanket. Do I practice what it says correctly; no, but I try. I love the Bible; it is one of my best friends. I can't do without it, and I hope that you feel the same way. God's Word for God's people; thanks be to God!



ANSWER FOR OCTOBER: (Who was Tertius?)

The name Tertius occurs only once in the Bible. Tertius was the **scribe who wrote down the words of Paul** in what later would be called Paul's Epistle to the Romans (Romans 16:22). Church tradition holds that Tertius started out his Christian career as one of the seventy disciples (Luke 10:1), and after his stint with Paul moved on to Iconium to succeed Sosipater as bishop there.

FEED NEW MEXICO KIDS

Little did we know, back in 2019, that our "one-time" project of assembling weekend snack packs to be given to food-challenged students in Rio Rancho would grow like it has! Because of the generosity of our congregation, other folks who hear about this ministry, and because of grants and gifts given, we have been able to increase our donations every year. We began this school term putting together and sending out 290 packs in July. August required 326 bags and September we sent out 330 bags. Then, we started getting phone calls! The need increased at one school far beyond what was predicted and a school we were not supporting called and requested help. It appears that we now need to assemble 480 bags per month. (We have a hard time saying "no", especially when children are hungry.)

This ministry could not happen without many volunteers. A team of individuals purchase each food item, a team sets up tables so that it is easier to pack bags the night before bagging day, many people donate any amount they can to cover the cost of food items, Jane Komatz staples food pantry information and encouragement cards that go into the bags, and many people encourage volunteers, pray for the children and the workers and support these efforts tirelessly. Because of the increased needs of hungry children we could use your help, call Wanda at (505) 796-4929 or Gordon at (505) 235-2674 if interested in donating some of your time or support.

By the way, because of the increase in hungry children we are now spending about \$3,360 per month during the school year.

Wildfire Recovery Effort

Prayers needed for the International Relief Team (IRT), including Linn Carlson, who are deploying to Paradise, CA November 13-20 to help in the California Wildfire long term recovery effort.

The 2018 wildfires in California were the deadliest and most destructive in the state's history. Vulnerable



families lost their homes, their livelihoods, and their hopes for the future. In the immediate aftermath and in response to an urgent request by the Butte County School District, International Relief Teams (IRT) provided funding for textbooks for students in Butte County who lost all of their school supplies in the fires. The Camp Fire alone destroyed 6 schools, damaged 8 schools, and affected nearly 4,000 students.

In 2021, IRT began working in the town of Paradise, CA to rebuild

homes for low income families and sent 41 volunteers on 5 teams to rebuild 7 homes. Paradise was nearly wiped off the map by the fire. Only 5% of buildings in the town remained without serious damage. In 2022, we are continuing to send volunteer teams to rebuild homes for as long as we are needed.

High Desert UMC recently purchased a 20 ft container unit. One onlooker said, "It's so big, someone could live in there." This will provide much needed storage for tables and other equipment, and free up indoor storage for supplies necessary to implement our many mission projects. In

addition, it will eliminate the need to continue paying a monthly fee for an

off-site storage shed, thus saving the church \$900 per year. The unit is located on the south west side of the church, and will have a fence to hide it from the street. There are doors on the north and east sides of the unit. It is fully permitted - after we jumped through many hoops with the city government.
