Andrew's example of bringing others to Jesus was Philip who we discussed on Sunday July 16th. His first response after Jesus called him was to find his personal friend Nathanael and tell him about Jesus. Friendships and relationships provide the most fertile soil for sharing our faith with others. MacArthur states: "When the reality of Christ is introduced into a relationship of love and trust that has already been established, the effect is powerful." When someone becomes a follower of Jesus Christ, their first impulse is to share it with a friend. Do you feel that way? Have you shared your love for Jesus with others?

And then there's Matthew, the tax collector. In Matthew 9:9, Jesus sees Matthew sitting at his tax collector's booth and says: "Follow me."

Matthew immediately got up and left everything and followed Jesus. Then the first thing he did was to invite his friends and colleagues to dinner at his house and introduce them to Jesus.

In his book, MacArthur states: "One thing I have observed in all of my years of ministry is that the most effective and important aspect of evangelism usually takes place in an individual, personal level. Most people do not come to Christ as an immediate response to a sermon they hear in a crowded setting. They come to Christ because of the influence of an individual." I have said it often that you will bring more people to a personal relationship with Jesus by how you live your daily life and share with others than all the sermons I will ever preach. There is no question that the most effective means of bringing someone to Jesus is on an individual basis.

The bottom line is that the Church needs more people like Andrew and Philip who understand the value of befriending just one person at a time and who are willing to step out of their comfort zones to share their love and faith in Jesus with others. Are you willing to be one of these people? Don't forget to invite your friends and neighbors to church.

While I was on vacation last month, I read a book by John MacArthur Ordinary Men, How the Master Shaped Greatness, and What He Wants to Do with You. The author discusses in detail the calling of each disciple by Jesus, their struggles and weaknesses, and what we know about them in the Bible and according to tradition. This reading affirmed much of what I already knew about the disciples and provided new insights and background into their lives and ministry. In many ways, they were just like you and me or the people we know. They were ordinary, hardworking people who had their faults, but Jesus saw potential in each one of them and used them to build His Church.

I found it interesting that the theme of one of my recent sermons of sharing our faith with others one-on-one, ran through the book. The first example that the author used was Andrew who we discussed on Sunday July 9th. As we discussed, Andrew was one of the first disciples called (John 1:40-42). He was always bringing others to Jesus. Remember what was the first thing he did after meeting Jesus? He went immediately to

OCTOBER SECOND MILE GIVING:

While Thanksgiving and Christmas are a few months away, we are already starting our holiday preparations. There are three opportunities for Second Mile Giving during October as noted below for helping others during the holiday season:

THANKSGIVING BOXES

For the last four years, High Desert has been providing Thanksgiving Boxes with all the items needed for a Thanksgiving dinner including the turkey to the clients of Haven House. They have indicated that they need 50 boxes this year. Haven House is the only domestic violence shelter in Sandoval County. They provide emergency shelter, case management, support groups, life-skill classes, legal advocacy, referral to job opportunities, housing and other supportive services, and therapeutic counseling for both women and their children. If you would like to support this ministry, please mark "Thanksgiving Boxes" on the memo line of your check to the church. We will purchase all the items and assemble the boxes.

CHRISTMAS GIFT CARDS

St. Joseph Mission School in San Fidel is one of our mission projects. The school serves 40 students from the Acoma and Laguna Pueblos. Last year, when we asked the principal Antonio Trujillo what we could do for the students at Christmas, he indicated that gift cards would be an excellent Christmas gift. Due to your generosity, we were able to give each student a \$50 gift card. This allowed the students to purchase what they really wanted for Christmas. We would like to continue this successful mission project and plan to purchase a \$25 or \$50 gift card for each student depending on how much is donated. OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

High Desert has participated in this mission project for several years, where members get a shoebox (any regular size will work), and fill it with toys, hygiene items, school supplies and a donation of \$10 for shipping and bring it to the church. We will take the boxes to Grace Outreach Church during collection week on November 17th, for distribution to children in need all around the world. We have been collecting items each month for the shoeboxes and will assemble these on November 17, 2023. You can also assemble your own box (instructions and empty boxes are available in the Narthex) or you can donate \$30 (\$20 for items and \$10 for shipping) to the church and Patty Latter will purchase the items. Last year we collected 127 boxes and our goal this year is 133 boxes. Please mark "Operations Christmas Child" on the memo line of your check.

As you can see, there are several opportunities to give and make a difference in the lives of children and those in need. These three projects demonstrate our commitment to share God's love in our immediate area, farther from home, and throughout the world.
