REUBEN'S RAMBLINGS

By now, you should realize that one of the main themes of my messages and ministry is establishing and strengthening our personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ. As one of my sons once told me, it's a relationship not a religion. It's not about rituals, ceremonies, and doctrine; it's a one-on-one relationship with the Lord. If your faith and beliefs are based on the order of worship on Sunday morning, communion, and the rules and regulations of the church, then you are not truly experiencing God and His Son Jesus Christ. You are missing out on the love and privilege that God offers to each one of us.

When Jesus died on the cross at Calvary, the veil in the Temple was torn from top to bottom signifying that everyone now has direct access to God. Jesus fulfilled the prophecy of Jeremiah 31:33-34 when God said: "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God and they will be my people. No longer will a man teach his neighbor, or a man his brother, saying: 'Know the Lord.'
Because they will all know me

from the least to the greatest." In the beginning, God created Adam and Eve, humanity, for companionship. In John 15:15, Jesus told His disciples that He would no longer consider them servants, but friends. Our Lord and Savior desires to be our friend, to have a personal relationship with each one of us.

Relationship is defined as the way two or more people are connected. Or the way people regard or behave toward each other. If God wants a personal relationship with us, how do we establish this relationship? First, you have to open up your heart to God and His Son Jesus and invite them in. God has already taken the first step by sending Jesus to die for our sins. Now we must take the next step by asking Him into our daily lives. If there are 1,000 steps between us and God, God will take 999. The last step is up to us.

Once we have accepted Jesus as our Lord and Savior, what's the next step? As all of us know, you have to work at a relationship. You should grow closer over time. Remember a relationship is a state of being connected. We remain connected by spending time with each other, getting to know each other. That's why having a daily quiet time of prayer and Bible reading is so essential to growing in your

relationship. If you haven't established this habit, I strongly encourage you.

As in any relationship, you grow closer as you get to know each other better. And the best way to get to know Jesus and His Father is to get involved in a weekly Bible study. This fall we are offering four excellent Bible studies: the Sunday morning class is studying the Gospel of Luke; the Monday morning class is studying 40 Days through the Book of Acts; the Wednesday morning is studying the Holy Spirit and the Psalms; and the Wednesday evening class is studying *The Story*, the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Find one you like and get involved!

Let me end with a serious question: "Do you know Jesus as a friend or is He a stranger to you?" Would He recognize you? On Judgment Day, will He know you by your first name? Remember there are no name tags in heaven! Don't miss the opportunity. Establish and strengthen your personal relationship with the Lord.

Worshiping in Spirit and Truth

When Jesus spoke to the woman at the well, He explained the importance of worshiping in spirit and truth.

John 4:23-24 (ESV) - 23 But the hour is coming, and is now here, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father is seeking such people to worship him. 24 God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth.

As disciples, Jesus' teaching to worship in spirit and truth applies to us as well. But what does that mean? First, it involves loving the Lord with all of our heart, soul, and strength. Without a heartfelt passion for God, worship lacks spirit. However, worship also involves knowledge of the love and grace offered by God through Jesus. Without an understanding of who He is and what He has done, worship lacks truth. As Jesus explained, authentic worship stems from a heart overflowing in spirit and mind grounded in truth.

This month, I challenge you to worship God the way that Jesus instructed the woman at the well. Reflect on who He is, what He has done, and all of His promises. Whether you worship in loud and expressive ways or through quiet meditations, let your worship involve your whole heart, mind, and soul for the one who is worthy of our praise.

Prayer: Loving Father, thank you for all that You have done for me. It is my desire to worship You in spirit and in truth, just as You told the woman at the well. Fill me with Your Spirit. Teach me Your truth. Move me to worship You with my whole heart, mind, and soul. In Jesus's name, AMEN.

ReadWest helps adult learners of English with basic vocabulary communication for many life and cultural situations as well as helps them to become literate in reading and writing English.

ReadWest Inc. is a non-profit adult literacy agency providing one-to-one tutoring sessions by trained certified volunteers. It is estimated that it costs \$150 to train and support a volunteer tutor and \$240 to provide instruction to a student. Through dedicated volunteers and donations, ReadWest strives to improve the literacy of the members of our community, thus allowing them to live more productive and enriched lives.

We had over **900 dozen home made cookies** donated to meet the needs for this weekend. Of the **144** 30 minute prayer slots available for the weekend, HDUMC filled **27** – we could feel your prayers. Twenty seven **(27)** team members humbly and tirelessly served on this team. Twenty four **(24)** residents /inmates were selected to participate in the weekend. Additionally, eight **(8)** residents/inmates that had previously attended a KAIROS weekend served as "Angels" or helpers/servants assisting the team. Imagine preparing and serving meals for approx. **60 persons 3 times a day** for three days = **540 meals** – plus snacks and beverages!
