Well, another Christmas has come and gone, and a new year is upon us! I would like to thank all of you who worshipped with us on Christmas Eve. The Christmas Eve services were beautiful as we closed with *Silent Night* and all the candles sparkled throughout the sanctuary.

Happy New Year! Can you believe that it already 2025? Each year brings us new opportunities and new challenges. We don't know what is going to happen in 2025; we don't know what lies ahead of us in the coming months. But we can be sure of one thing and that is that Jesus Christ will be with us. Remember His final words in Matthew 28:20 - "And lo, I will be with you always, even to the end of the age." All we have to do is to walk in faith. So, let me give you some suggestions for walking in faith in 2025. First, if you have not already done it, set aside a quiet time with the Lord each day. Find some time each and every day to be alone with the Lord in prayer and reading the Bible.

If our Lord and Savior needed time alone with His Father to meet the demands and temptations of each day, how much more do we need to spend time alone with God in prayer? I guarantee you that it will make each day go better for you. Psalm 119:105 states: "Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path." God has given us the best instruction manual for life, the Let the Bible be your Bible. roadmap or compass as you navigate the ups and downs of 2025. You could make it a goal to read through the Bible this year or to study certain books such as the Gospels or the Apostle Paul's letters. Or you could do like I do and use different devotional books to guide your daily scripture readings. You may find the *Upper* Room or Daily Bread to be helpful. If you really want a challenge on giving your life to God, I would recommend My Utmost for His Highest by Oswald Chambers.

I would also encourage you to get involved in a weekly Bible Study. There's Tony Smith's Bible Study on the Book of Revelations Sunday morning at 10 am. On Monday morning, we have a Bible Study at 10:30 am which is studying various books of the Bible. The Bible Study Wednesday on morning at 10:30 am is studying the Holy Spirit. And our Wednesday night class which meets at 5:30 pm is studying Act Like Jesus. Finally, make it a habit to be in worship each Sunday. I have found over the years that there is nothing that compares to Christian fellowship. Hebrews 10:25 states: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another." It is my hope and prayer that each of us will grow closer to the Lord in 2025. Happy New Year!

NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION



Yes, Linn Carlson is "on the road again"!!


