### **DECEMBER SECOND MILE GIVING**

#### **FEED NEW MEXICO KIDS**

Did you know that many students in Rio Rancho are homeless and even more go hungry, especially on the weekend? A hungry child is twice as likely to repeat a grade; three times as likely to be suspended; and a hungry teen is five times as likely to commit suicide.

To address this need, High Desert UMC through Women with Purpose (WWP) has been participating in and supporting Feed New Mexico Kids, a local nonprofit organization, by providing weekend food packs to children in our local community. Currently, WWP and other volunteers assemble over 544 food packs per month which are given to over 100 students in five local schools. In addition, we are now working with St. Joseph Mission School in San Fidel to provide food packages to their 38 students. Originally, it cost about \$7 for each food package, but with rising food prices this is going up.

Our Second Mile Giving during December will go to the purchase of the food for these packs. You can support this worthwhile ministry by writing "Feed NM Kids" on the memo line of your check to the church. Thanks for making a difference in the lives of these children.

#### **4PAWS PET FOOD**

Our Second Mile Giving for December will also go to 4Paws Pet Food. In partnership with the 4Paws Pet Food Bank in Corrales, High Desert UMC is providing free dog and cat food to the clients of the High Desert Methodist Food Pantry each month on the first Friday.

This ministry supports those in our community who are struggling to feed their companion animals. Because of limited financial resources, many Pantry clients give up their personal food to feed their pets. Over the past year, we have been able to help our Pantry clients continue to enjoy the positive benefits of pet ownership by keeping their pets fed and out of shelters. While in Costa Rica, Linn & her team will once again work with Missionary Lillian Solt (who is under the jurisdiction of the Latin American Mission) & her staff of CEDCAS (means Center for Health Education & Health Services CEDCAS is a non-profit that was established by Lillian in 1985 (50 years ago) & whose goal is to promote & maintain "whole person health care", meaning, physical, emotional, social & spiritual health for those that they serve.

**CEDCAS** & the Baptist church in Santo Tomas have begun to build <u>a youth center.</u>

### SO.... WHAT WILL LINN & HER TEAM BE DOING?

Our team will be working on building, along with at least one welder, from California, who will be joining the team. He's been on other CEDCAS work teams.

Our work will include:

- Assisting the welder cutting the iron, painting the welded joints, etc. for the second floor
   & the stairway to the second floor.
- Plumbing including laying the pipes for the drains & bathrooms on the first floor
- Filling in the drain site that will go down under the first floor. It involves moving large rock, smaller rock & then to fill in the drain space.
- Painting at the church
- Assisting with VBS.

Last year, HDUMC provided funds to cover public school uniforms for children who were unable to attend school due to lack of resources to buy their uniforms. We are so grateful for your generosity. If you would like to contribute to this cause again, please see below.
