

COLORADO RIVER LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The mission of the Colorado River Leadership Program is to promote community leadership by developing knowledgeable, skilled leaders committed to building bridges of understanding across diverse segments of our community. The program begins in September and continues with one session per month through May. The nine-session program covers issues and topics key to our community as evidenced by the curriculum outlined in this brochure.

This packet includes the program outline and an application for participation. There are several levels at which your business or organization can provide sponsorships to the program. For additional information or if you have questions, please contact Norma Brummett at (360) 770-6273. The more sponsorship and support we have from the business community, the more successful the program. All checks should be made payable to Colorado River Women's Council.

CORPORATE SPONSORSHIP:

\$250 - \$500 Sponsorships are used to off-set costs of providing the program. In addition, the corporate sponsorship may provide tuition for participants in need of financial assistance.

SESSION SITE HOST:

1. Provide a meeting space for approximately 30 people.
2. Provide breakfast snacks, beverages and lunches for same.
3. Provide contact person to work with session coordinator for necessary audio/visual equipment and any special program needs (if applicable).

Optional: Assist in providing transportation for a tour (as needed at one of the sessions that includes community site tours.) Since the cost of renting a van or bus for a day varies, if your company has one and can provide a driver, that would be appreciated.

PARTICIPANT SPONSORSHIP:

Your business may provide \$200 towards an employee's tuition cost of \$250 (limit three per annual program per business). In addition, your commitment that the participant(s) must be given time off to attend all nine sessions is required. The sessions are planned for the second Wednesday of each month, but there may be scheduling changes.

Mission

Provide community leadership by developing knowledgeable, skilled leaders committed to building bridges of understanding across diverse segments of our communities to ensure a high quality of life and positive growth.

Program Summary and Outline

The nine-month program consists of an integrated series of sessions, designed to build leadership skills and awareness of issues affecting our community. A planning committee organizes the sessions with the assistance of the input given by past participants. Participants learn how the Colorado River communities work, who makes them work and why. The program offers many different perspectives on issues of critical concern. The process takes place through panel discussions, group discussions and tours, and opens dialog among class members and area leaders. First-hand exposure to issues facing our communities provides for an even better understanding of those issues. Leadership capacities are enhanced as participants are challenged to complete class projects, in teams and individually, through a variety of stimulating and educational exercises. Full day sessions (usually beginning at 8:30am) are held once a month and are scheduled for the second Wednesday of each month, September through May. The program concludes with a graduation luncheon, where participants are awarded Completion Plaques. Attendance is required in order to graduate. No more than two sessions can be missed, and makeup homework will be assigned.
