The purpose of the Center is to seek out the needy in our community and to provide a place to give service to others. We work with some wonderful non-profit organizations that are dedicated to help the needy. We have a wonderful spirit that radiates throughout the Center. We do our best to emulate the Savior and try to follow His example as we serve those in need. So many great things happen at the Center. We will have over 200,000 hours of service given in 2022. Our toy department will make and deliver over 20,000 toys to be given to needy children. We will hand-

make and deliver approximately 3,000 quilts. We also make weighted blankets to help calm children with autism or trauma. These are just a few examples of the approximately 70 items we produce. We

are often asked, "How many people are paid?" It's such a wonderful blessing to have so many people volunteer their time. No one is paid in monetary terms, just in blessings. When you find someone willing to do something for someone else and not expect anything in return, that's when you find the best people on earth. That's who we have at the Center!

REHABILITATIVE HEALTH CENTER (RHC)

We welcomed guest speakers from the Idaho Falls crisis center, RHC (Rehabilitative Health Center), to our August 17 prayer meeting. Executive Director James McLain and

With 250 employees and a 20-bed dorm, RHS uses bedding from IFAHC. They are open 24/7 to provide crisis intervention, all at no cost to the individual. They provide case

management and staff a medical unit

equivalent to a hospital emergency room. Referrals to community resources are made within 24 hours. The

Governor has mandated that RMS remain open at all times, even during COVID, and McLain stated that they accepted COVID positive clients during the pandemic shutdown. Serving clients from Utah, Wyoming, and Idaho, RHS has experienced great success in saving the lives of vulnerable

adults in crisis. Last calendar quarter they served 1,500 clients.

Assistant Director Ken Asay, a veteran of multiple wars, has the longest tenure as a crisis worker in Idaho and has been with RHS since the beginning. Asay states that there are three primary groups of clients: those experiencing

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addiction, suicidal ideation, and severe mental illness. He said that RHS has a loose definition of "crisis" and helps a variety of clients including veterans with PTSD. Located northwest of IFAHC and initially modeled after Montana's state crisis centers, RHS is one of seven Idaho centers developed eight years ago under the Governor's direction in response to the lack of crisis services available statewide.
