Soup Kitchen

Erik from the Soup Kitchen came and presented on July 26th. The soup kitchen started in 1984. They serve a meal from 12pm– 1pm every day. The soup kitchen is open to everyone, but the majority of the people are between 30 and 50 years old. They serve between 80-150 people each day. This adds up to 3500-4000 meals each month. Near the end of this year the soup kitchen will reach its 1 millionth meal served. The soup kitchen is located at 301 South Boulevard. They are always in need of volunteers either individuals or groups of 8-10. All food is donated and protein is a big need. They also except Venmo, PayPal, and checks.
