HEALTHY CARE SOLUTIONS

Michelle Haven and Merilee Hunt, representatives from Healthy

Care Solutions, visited us on December 13 and shared their work in the community and how we support those efforts. In business for the past 12 years, Healthy Care Solutions currently serves about 200 active clients offering counselling, CBRS, case management, peer and family support, and payee services. Case managers help coordinate services for clients with complex cases and multiple service providers. Peer support providers help a client in ways such as sharing their experience with therapy to help a client transition to a new service. Family support helps parents when children need for behavioral services. Payee services are available at no cost to handicapped indi-

viduals who need assistance with paying bills and managing their money.

One of the main items ordered from IFAHC are weighted blankets. Many families cannot afford a retail weighted blanket as they are struggling just to provide necessities. October through mid-January is a time when suicide rates increase, and many in our community are at their most vulnerable for feelings of being forgotten, lonely,

and isolated. Weighted blankets calm the nervous system and can

benefit children because they can feel like a warm hug or providing comfort to the elderly by just having the weight on their lap.

Did you know? Weighted blankets are used as an alternative therapy for conditions like anxiety, insomnia, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), and autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Occupational therapists sometimes use weighted blankets as part of sensory therapy for children. The theory behind these blankets

HEALTHY CARE SOLUTIONS, CON'T

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is that the pressure provides therapeutic value. It's like a baby's swaddling blanket that soothes it as it sleeps. Weighted blankets may help some people with ASD or ADHD who are overstimulated by noise around them. At bedtime, the blanket's pressure may help them feel safe and protected.

Weighted blankets can calm the nerves. Pressure from the blanket may trigger nervous system responses that lower heart rate and breathing. Weighted blankets also trigger natural chemicals like serotonin, a chemical which helps calm the mind and body, or oxytocin, a feel-good chemical which can improve immune system response and ease pain and stress.
