



IDAHO FALLS RESCUE MISSION

Charles Hale is the Program and Operations Director for the Idaho Falls Rescue Mission. Their main goal is to dig into people's lives and get to the root of how they can help them be successful. The Idaho Falls Rescue Mission includes: The Haven, City of Refuge, Ruth House, Gospel Rescue Mission, and the 1st Street Thrift Store. They provide services such as helping individuals obtain IDs, vouchers for fuel, and rental assistance. They also have a food ministry called Serving Hope where they provide breakfast, lunch, and dinner to their guests

and anyone else in need. They are hoping to open another dining hall at The Haven to serve the women and children. They will benefit from hot pads and aprons made at the


