Currently, they operate three homes in Idaho Falls, each accommodating 3 to 4 residents. They also extend their services to individuals living at home or with family.

GUEST SPEAKER



On April 21, Becky Jackson from Ambitions of Idaho came to speak to us and explain their organization and how they use the products we supply to them. Ambitions of Idaho is an extension of an organization first organized in Washington

in 1992.

Their goal is to help developmentally delayed adults in our area. They provide homes for clients who can't live alone and need 24-hour-a-day assistance. Typical homes are maintained for three adults, currently serving 33 people in an age range of 19-65 years old.

These clients typically have health and/or mental issues which preclude their living alone, and are homeless or come from families who can't provide for them.

It is non-denominational, and can serve persons coming from jail, for their own safety, and some are able to work a little. One resident currently serves here at the Humanitarian Center one day a week, and others are provided job coaches to help them find work and to be successful at their jobs.

They have a highly qualified staff, because they can be picky about who they hire, and pay better than most agencies.

Clients who are on Social Security pay their own rent and utilities. This service requires a lifetime commitment, because most clients don't move on to live an independent life.

Becky reported they appreciate using many of our products, including hygiene bags, quilts and weighted blankets. They always need and appreciate volunteers, so if you find yourself with some time to spare, check with Ambitions of Idaho and see how they can use your talents.

GUEST SPEAKER



We recently had the opportunity to hear from Kimberly Murphy with Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA). CASA is an organization dedicated to supporting children who have been abused, neglected, or abandoned. Their mission is to ensure every child has a voice in court and the chance to grow up in a safe, permanent home. As Kimberly emphasized, "Every child has a right to a safe and permanent home."

CASA volunteers, who come from all walks of life, advocate for the best interests of children in the foster care system. In addition to legal support, they provide children with basic essentials— especially for those who have had very little—reminding them that they are seen, supported, and cared for.

CASA was founded in the 1980s when a judge recognized the need for dedicated advocates for children navigating the foster system. What began as one judge's vision quickly grew as volunteers stepped forward to help. While CASA's primary focus is always the child, they also work to support families and encourage reunification when it is safe and possible.
