



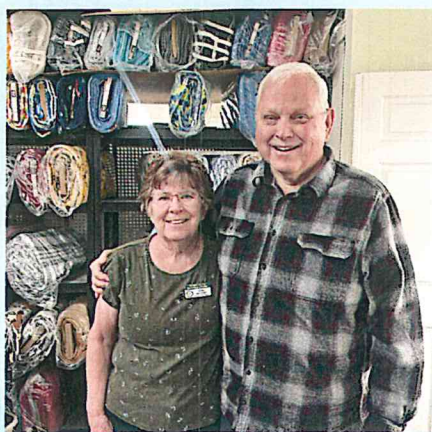

Guest Speakers Presentation



Jenn Baxter shared the following:

Over Christmas, she and many volunteers spent a week in Tijuana, Mexico. They served an orphanage with 38 children and helped with another orphanage of 27 children. She said the director of the orphanage's name is Martin. He was an orphan at age 6 through age 10. He lived in this orphanage. After he graduated from high school, he went to college and then received his master's degree in broadcasting. During his career, the director of the orphanage had kidney failure and they approached Martin and asked if he would be the director of the orphanage for a year, he has now been the director for over 12 years. Elder Baxter shared the following:

During their week there, they were assigned ten different projects. Some included:

1. Pulling large rocks out of the dry canal for irrigation for fruit trees and vegetables.
 - 2.They had a need for a grey water line for irrigation. They dug the lines and it took 3-4 days to get down to the level that was required to put the lines in.
 - 3.At the other orphanage, they were able to give them our quilts– one of the kids was hugging the quilt so tight and was so grateful to have a quilt to sleep with.
 - 4.The jump ropes were given to the children. One of the workers said they only had one jump rope for the whole orphanage to share. They were grateful to get jump ropes for each of the kids to use as they wanted.
 - 5.The knitted toys were presented to the kids. The little girls loved them.
 - 6.Both orphanage directors and children were so grateful for the items we gave to them. They shared a song with the volunteers, "God is so good, God is so good, he is so good to me"
- Elder Baxter testified, "The work the volunteers do, the items that you work so hard on, go so far for so many in need. We are witnesses of the hard work. Thank you for your time and talents to make these kids have a better life".
