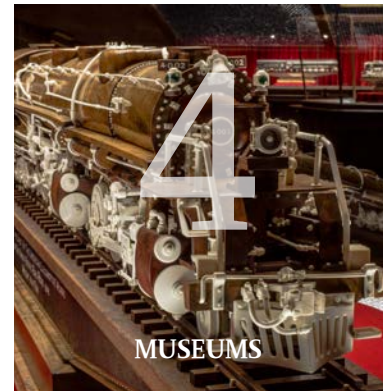
Founded in 1808, Tuscarawas County has a significant part in national and state histories. Tuscarawas, which loosely translated means “old town” or “open mouth” in Delaware/Lenape is the site of Ohio’s settlement, Schoenbrunn Village, the location of Ohio’s only Revolutionary War fort, Fort Laurens and Ohio’s Official State Play, *Trumpet in the Land*, and proudly boasts two National Historic Landmarks—The Dennison Railroad Depot Museum and Historic Zoar Village.

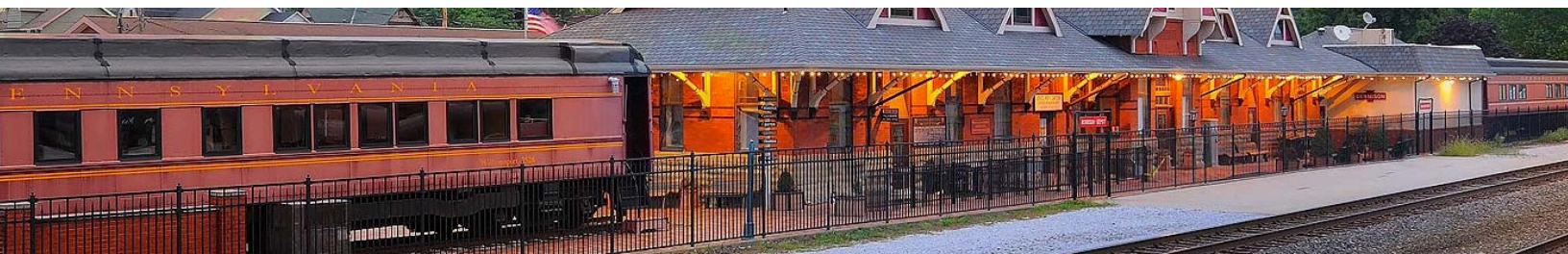

The Age of Steam Roundhouse Museum stores, repairs, and operates the historic railroad equipment collection of the late Jerry Jacobson. The site features an impressive, 18 stall roundhouse, 115-foot turntable, and fully functional repair shop that are devoted to over 20 preserved steam locomotives and other railroad equipment in the collection. Guided tours are offered to the public on weekends, between April and November, and do require the use of soled footwear.
