

Tuscarawas County, Ohio


Founded in 1808, Tuscarawas County has a significant part in national and state histories. Tuscarawas, which loosely translated means "old town" or "open mouth" in Delaware/Lenape is the site of Ohio's settlement, Schoenbrunn Village, the location of Ohio's only Revolutionary War fort, Fort Laurens and Ohio's Official State Play, *Trumpet in the Land*, and proudly boasts two National Historic Landmarks—The Dennison Railroad Depot Museum and Historic Zoar Village.

HISTORY

Historical sites dot our countryside, each telling a unique story of conquest, exploration, and cultural exchange. These sites serve as windows into our past, reminding us of the struggles and achievements of those who came before us.

CLAY CAPITAL HERITAGE CENTER

Located in what was once known as the Clay Capital of the World, this museum offers the rich history of the rise in the clay pipe and brick manufacturing that dominated the area. See the unique products of the times and be sure to check out the folk art created by the clay workers and ask to see a 'whimsy'.

Ohio's only Revolutionary War Fort. The outline of the fort remains along with artifacts found during archaeological digs. The Fort Laurens museum offers a video of the history of the fort along with Colonial Era artifacts and weaponry.

Meaning "Huts of Grace", was the site of the massacre of 96 Christian Native Americans during the Revolutionary War period. This historical park and museum located on the original grounds pays tribute to the memory of the settlement.

SCHOENBRUNN VILLAGE

Established in 1772 as the first Christian settlement in Ohio, this Moravian mission organized by David Zeisberger and the Delaware Indians offers visitors a unique glimpse into life during the time of the American Revolution. Guests can explore 17 reconstructed log buildings on the original sites along with a museum and the original cemetery.

AGE OF STEAM ROUNDHOUSE MUSEUM

The private collection of 20 locomotive engines of the late Jerry Jacobson is showcased at the Age of Steam Roundhouse. The 115-foot turntable offers an impressive glimpse into the former life of this 18 stall brick roundhouse. See freight and passenger cars as well as steam engines currently being restored to their former glory. A tour of this facility requires proper shoes that cover the entire foot. (no sandals, flip flops or beach shoes)
