

## Additional Requirements

- 100% cotton thread in colors to match
- 70" (177.80cm) square batting



## Cutting

**WOF = Width of Fabric.** WOF of a Fat Eighth is approximately 21".

### Fabric A, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 6½" x 8½" rectangles; from the remaining strip cut
- (4) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (8) 1½" x 8½" strips
- (3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (12) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric B, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (1) 6½" x 8½" rectangle; from the remaining strip cut
- (4) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (12) 1½" x 8½" strips
- (1) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (4) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric C, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (3) 6½" x 8½" rectangles
- (3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (12) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabrics D, E, F and G, cut from each:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 6½" x 8½" rectangles; from the remaining strip cut
- (4) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (8) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric H, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (1) 6½" x 8½" rectangle; from the remaining strip cut
- (3) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (8) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabrics I and J, cut from each:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (3) 6½" x 8½" rectangles; from the remaining strip cut
- (4) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (4) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric K, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 6½" x 8½" rectangles; from the remaining strip cut
- (2) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (4) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabrics L, M, N and O, cut from each:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (1) 6½" x 8½" rectangle; from the remaining strip cut
- (4) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (4) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric P, cut:

- (2) 1½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (4) 1½" x 8½" strips

### Fabric Q, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (2) 6½" x 8½" rectangles

### Fabric R, cut:

- (1) 6½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (1) 6½" x 8½" rectangle

### Fabric S, cut:

- (9) 2½" x WOF; sub-cut
  - (25) 2½" x 10½" vertical sashing strips
- (6) 2½" x WOF for horizontal sashing
- (7) 2½" x WOF for borders

### Fabric T, cut:

- (7) 2½" x WOF, for binding

## Instructions


*All seam allowances are ¼" and pieces are sewn right sides together.*

### Blocks

*Press seam allowances towards the block frames.*


1. Refer to the table on the following page to select (1) 6½" x 8½" rectangle for the Block Center and (4) 1½" x 8½" strips for the Frame.
2. Sew a Frame strip to each side edge of the Block Center. (**Fig. 1**)

3. Sew a Frame strip to the top and bottom edges of the Block Center to complete a Block (8½" x 10½"). (Fig. 2)

4. Repeat Steps 1 through 3 to make all thirty Blocks, substituting Block Center and Frame fabrics for each Block as indicated in the table provided (shown right).

## Quilt Top Assembly

**Note:** Follow the **Quilt Layout** diagram on page 5 while assembling the quilt. Measure rows and quilt center before cutting long sashing strips and borders to ensure perfect fit. Press seam allowances towards the sashing and borders.

- Sew Blocks 1 through 6 together, in numerical order from left to right, alternating with (5) **Fabric S** sashing strips into Row 1 (10½" x 58½").
- Repeat Step 5, to make Rows 2 through 5, continuing to sew the Blocks in numerical order.
- Sew together (3) **Fabric S** horizontal sashing strips end-to-end into a long strip. Repeat to make a second long strip. Cut (4) 2½" x 58½" long sashing strips.
- Sew together Rows and long sashing strips to complete the Quilt Center (58½" square).
- Sew together (3) **Fabric S** border strips end-to-end. Cut (2) 2½" x 58½" side borders. Sew to the left and right sides of the Quilt Center.
- Sew together (2) **Fabric S** border strips end-to-end. Repeat to make a second strip. Cut (2) 2½" x 62½" top/bottom borders. Sew to the top and bottom edges of the Quilt Center to complete the Quilt Top (62½" square).

## Finishing

11. Sew together the 2½" **Fabric T** binding strips end-to-end using diagonal seams. Press seams open. Press the binding in half wrong sides together.
12. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, and quilt top (right side up). Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the top after quilting is completed.
13. Leaving an 8" tail of binding, sew the binding to the top of the quilt through all layers matching all raw edges. Miter corners. Stop approximately 12" from where you started. Lay both loose ends of binding flat along quilt edge. Where the loose ends meet, fold them back on themselves and press to form a crease. Using this crease as your stitching line, sew the two open ends of the binding right sides together. Trim seam to ¼" and press open. Finish sewing binding to quilt.
14. Turn the binding to the back of quilt and hand-stitch in place.
