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TIPS FOR SUCCESS

- 1. PATTERN: This kit includes a printed version of your pattern – be sure to read through your entire pattern before you begin cutting your fabrics! In some cases, a digital version of your pattern may be available for download in your pattern library. Simply log in to your Craftsy account to access it. If for any reason a newer version of your pattern becomes available, we'll send you an email with instructions about how to access it.
- 2. BLADE: Is your rotary blade sharp and ready? A sharp blade will require you to use less energy when cutting! If you see small threads still intact when you cut through your fabric, that's a good indication it's time to change your blade.
- **3. MACHINE:** Prepare for sewing success by ensuring that your sewing machine needle is sharp. Are you experiencing breakage of your top thread, or skipped stitches? Do you hear a quiet popping sound when your needles move through the fabric? These are all signs that your needle is dull and it's time for a change.

- 50wt Cotton Thread

General Guidelines

Please read the entire pattern once through before starting. Use a 1/4" seam allowance unless otherwise instructed.

PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Fabric Prep


Separate 168 charm squares into two groups: 84 darks and 84 lights*.

*Some fabric collections might not have an even number of dark and light prints. In that case, separate the charm squares into two groups as best you can. This quilt is designed to be scrappylooking, so a few patches that are lower in contrast than others will provide visual interest!

Half-Square Triangle Block Assembly

STEP 1

On the wrong side of a light charm square, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner with your preferred marking tool. Repeat this for all light charm squares..



STEP 2

Place one light print square and one dark print square right sides together. Sew a 1/4" seam on both sides of the drawn diagonal line (see diagrams).



STEP 3

Cut along the drawn diagonal line. Press seams towards the dark print.



STEP 4


Repeat steps 2 and 3 to make 168 half-square triangle blocks



Pinwheel Block Assembly


STEP 1

Referring to the diagrams, lay out four half-square triangles and arrange them to create a pinwheel. Sew the top left HST to the bottom left HST. Sew the top right HST to the bottom right HST. Press seams in the directions of the arrows in the diagram.




STEP 2


Place the right half of the block on top of the left half of the block and sew together.



STEP 3

To reduce bulk in the seams, use a seam ripper to remove the horizontal stitches within the vertical seam allowance as indicated by the circle and arrow below. Remove the stitches on both the front side and the backside. This will allow you to press the seams in a clock-wise fashion, following the arrows, and all seams will lay nicely flat.






PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

Quilt Top Assembly

Assemble your quilt according to the diagram bellow.

Sew blocks together to create rows. Press seams in opposite directions from row to row. For example, all seams in the first row will be pressed to the right, and all seams in the second row will be pressed to the left. Repeat this alternating sequence. Join rows.



Finishing Quilt

Layer, quilt, and bind with the 2.5" strips as desired.
