





Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Steampunk Panel-36 inches - Parchment (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 34 ½" x 42 ¾" rectangle, centered on the panel

From the Urban Legend - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 42 ¾" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 47 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Urban Legend - Gray (C), cut:

- (36) Template 1 triangles.
- (36) Template 3 triangles.

From the Tonal Gears - Brass (D), cut:

• (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ½" squares.

From the Gears - Black (E), cut:

- (8) Template 2 triangles.
- (4) Template 4 pieces.

From the Butterflies & Flowers - Black (F), cut:

• (8) Template 2 triangles.

From the Keys - Parchment (G), cut:

• (8) Template 2 triangles.

From the Hats & Scissors - Parchment (H), cut:

• (8) Template 2 triangles.

From the Octopus & Gears - Rust (I), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 57 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 51 ½" strips.

From the Hot Air Balloons - Parchment (J), cut:

- (2) 4 ½" x 61 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 4 ½" x 59 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.


From the Bicycles - Parchment (Backing), cut:

• (2) 67" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 67" x 77" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ¾" Fabric B strip to each side of the 34 ½" x 42 ¾" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block** to measure 35 ½" x 45 ½".

- 2. Place (1) Fabric C Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric F Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 2). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.
- 3. Place (1) Fabric C Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric F Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 3). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 1 (Fig. 4). Trim the unit to measure $5\frac{1}{2}$ " square.
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.







5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figures 5-7 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (8) of each unit square for Unit 2 through Unit 4.







6. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ½" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 9).








- 7. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric D square to the upper right corner of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 11).
- 8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (8) Block One squares total.





9. Repeat Steps 6-7 and refer to Figures 12-14 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (8) of each block square for Block Two through Block Four.



- 10. Refer to Figure 15 and sew together
- (1) Fabric C Template 1 triangle,
- (1) Fabric C Template 3 triangle and
- (1) Fabric E Template 4 piece to make
- (1) 5 ½" Block Five square. Repeat to make (4) Block Five squares total.



- 11. Follow Figure 16 and sew together (9) assorted Blocks to make the Left Side Border.
- 12. Repeat Step 10 and refer to Figures 17-19 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, the Top Border and the Bottom Border.



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

- 13. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 47 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 16. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 57 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 1/2" x 51 1/2" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


- 17. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 61 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 18. Sew (1) $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 59 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 19. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 20. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 21. Bind as desired.
