### Techniques:

1/4" piecing  
Raw Edge Applique  
Faux Trapunto

### Another Materials:

Mistifuse - 10" x 12 1/2"  
Light fusible interfacing - 4" square  
Hobbs Batting (80% cotton 20% poly blend) - 4" square  
Transfer or freezing paper



### Fabrics:

-  **A** Light Mauve  
7 3/4" x 12 1/2"
-  **B** Medium Mauve  
4" x 12 1/2"
-  **C** Dark Mauve  
4" x 12 1/2"
-  **D** Dark Grey  
10" x 12 1/2"

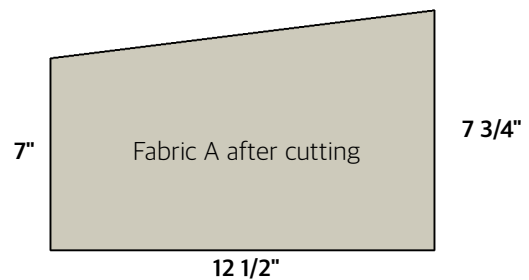
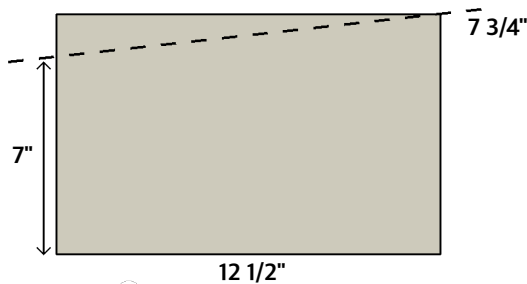
**Block size: 12 1/2" square**

### Cutting Instructions:

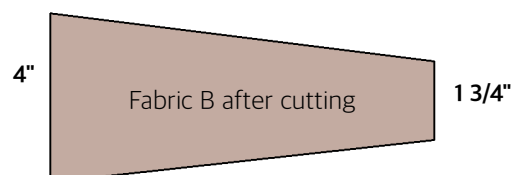
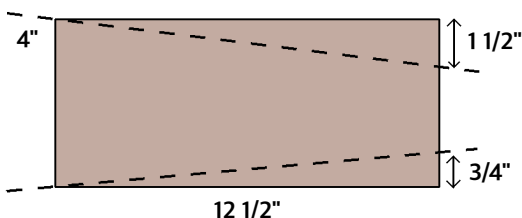
Light Mauve **A** Fabric:

One rectangle of 7 3/4" x 12 1/2". On the **left side** measure **7"** from the bottom to the top and mark. Cut a line from the 7" mark to the top right side. Follow the diagram below (I am a visual quilter):



Medium Mauve **B** Fabric:

One rectangle of 4" x 12 1/2". On the **right side** make a mark 3/4" from the bottom and another mark 1 1/2" from the top and cut. See diagram below:





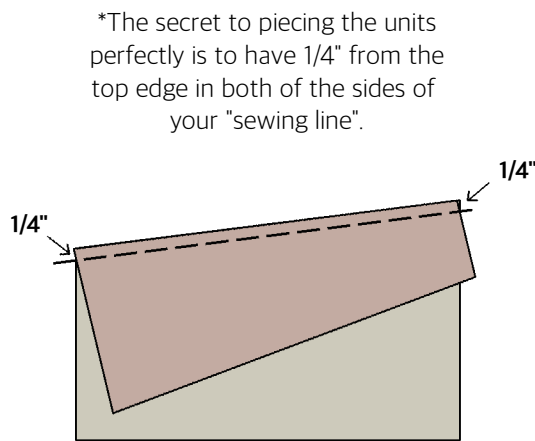
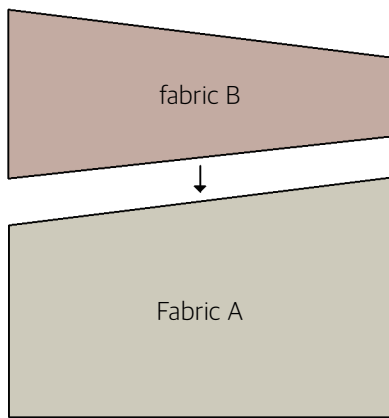
Dark Mauve **C** Fabric:

One rectangle of **4" x 12 1/2"**. On the **left side** mark **2 1/2" from the top** and cut a diagonal line to the bottom right side. See the diagram below:



**Time to piece the Verona's sunset background!**

Place the **fabric B** facing the **fabric A**, following the diagram below, pin in place and sew **1/4"**. Press to the **fabric B**.

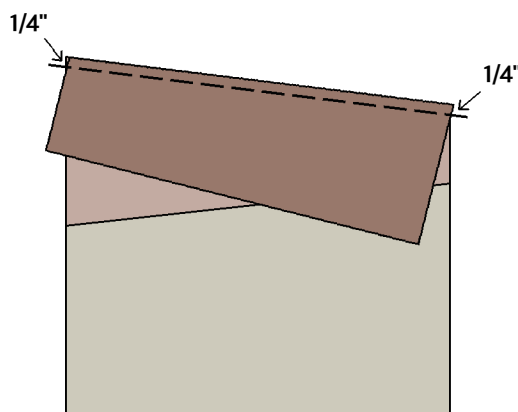
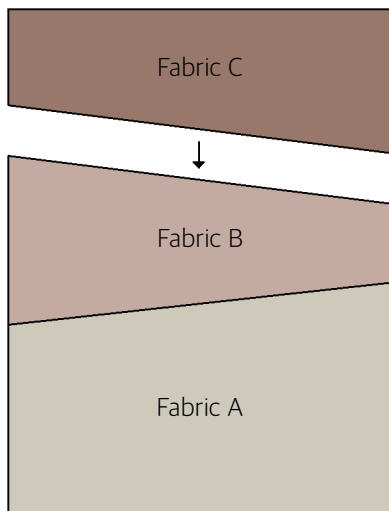


\*The secret to piecing the units perfectly is to have 1/4" from the top edge in both of the sides of your "sewing line".

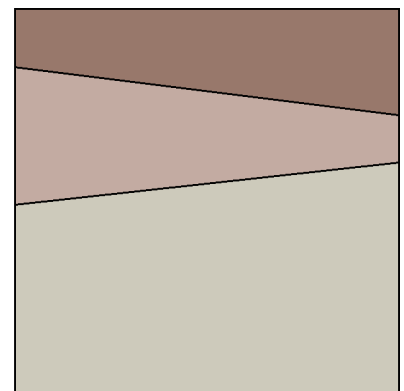

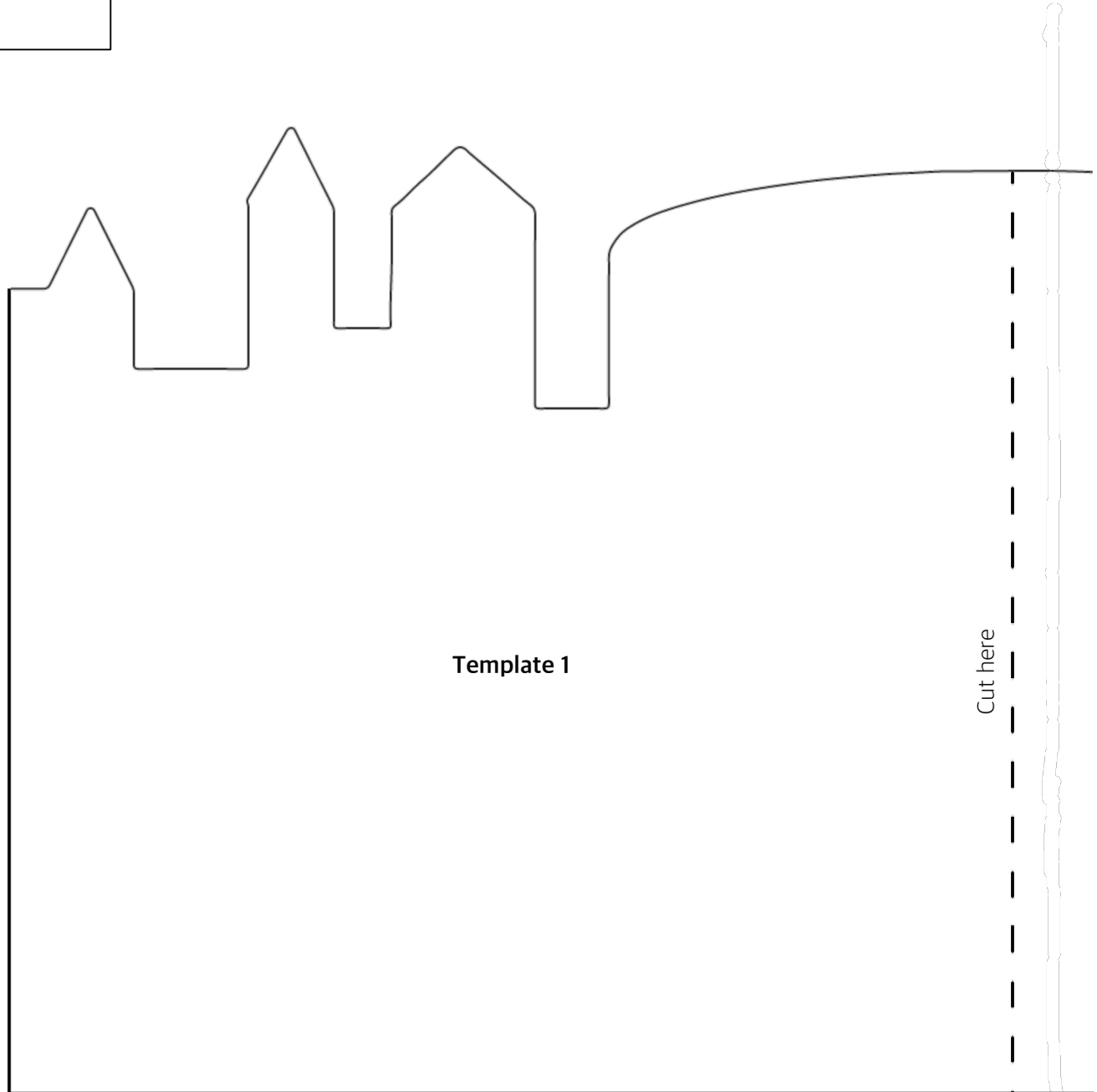


Dark Grey **D** Fabric:

One rectangle of **10" x 12 1/2"** and fusible with **Mistifuse** on the **back side of the fabric D**. Cut the two **"Verona skyline" paper templates** and glue it together following the instructions.

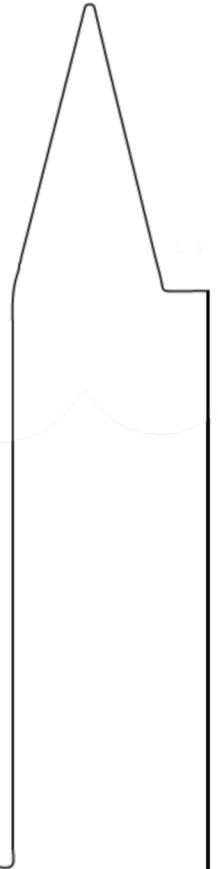
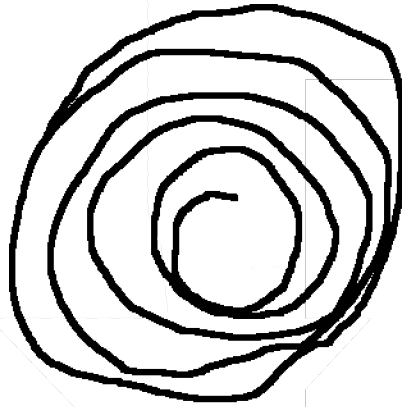

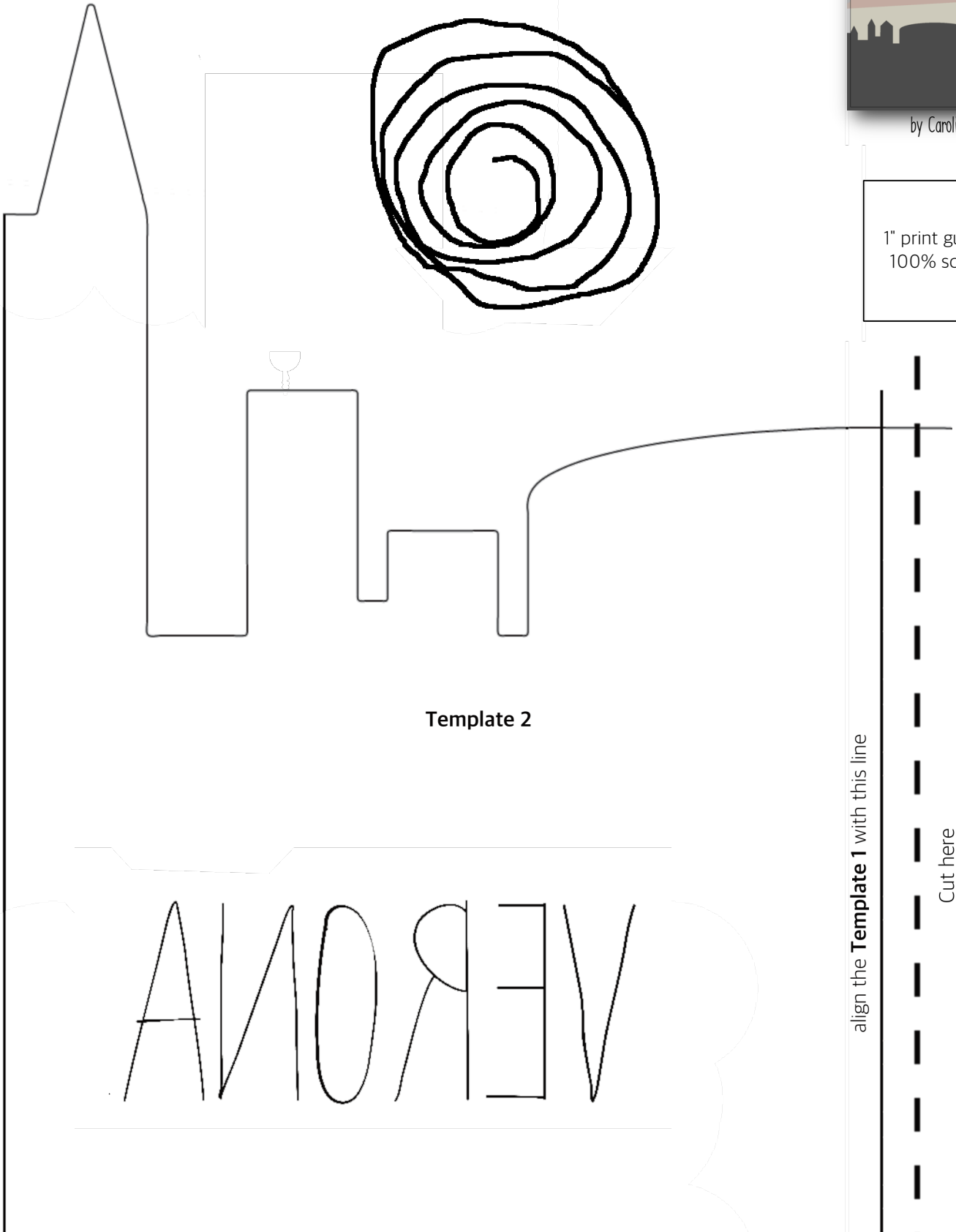


Reversed Template 2 for fusible applique (like Heat n Bond)

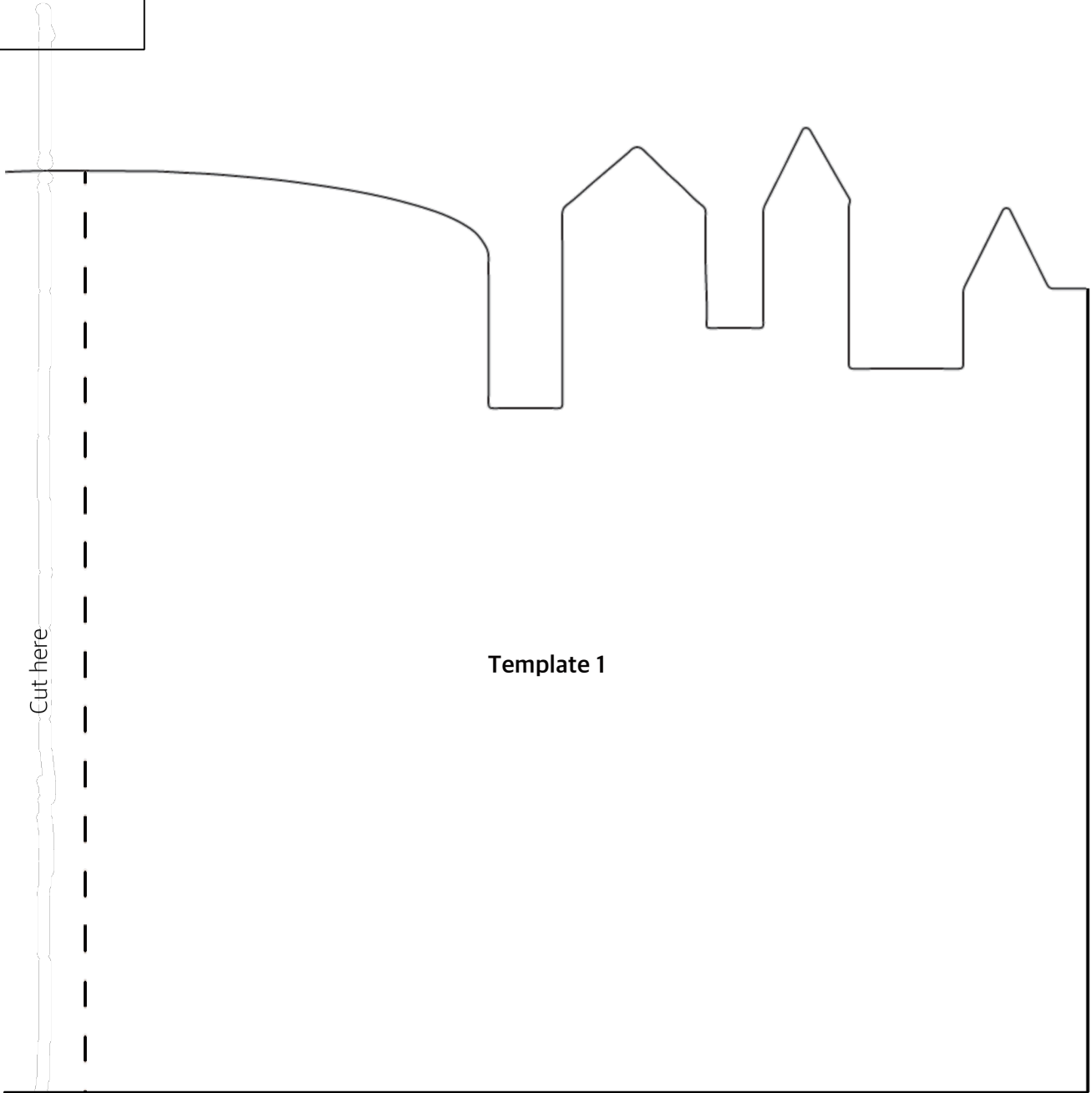

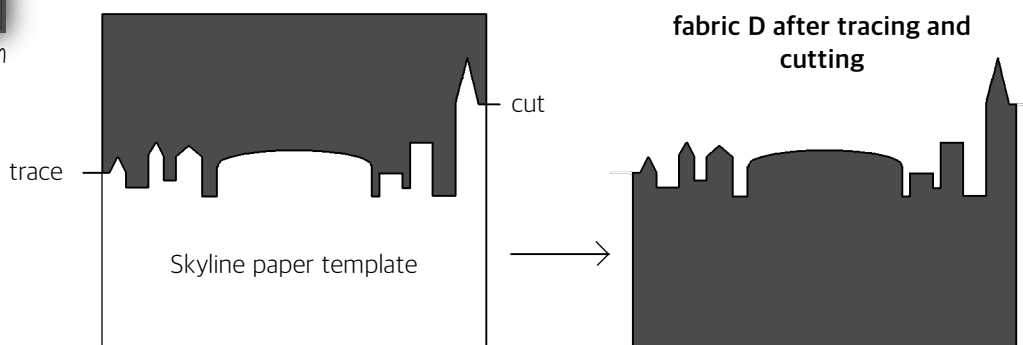

### Block Assembly:

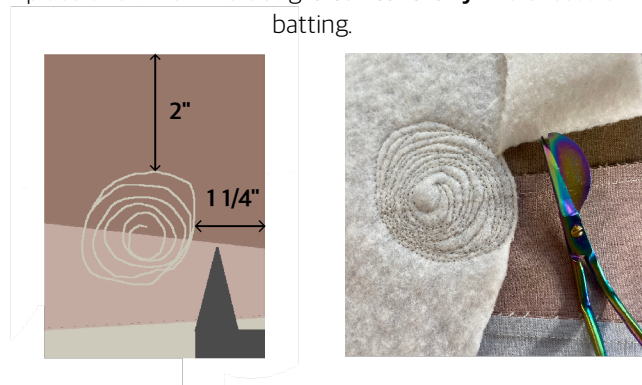
Use the **Verona's skyline template** to trace and cut the **10" x 12 1/2" dark grey D fabric**. See the image below:



Align the Verona's skyline with the 12 1/2" square sunset's background block matching the bottom and both sides. Press in place. Stitch 1/8" around the Skyline using Aurifil 50wt color 6724 from the "Verona Mauve" Color Builders Box.



Transfer the **"Verona"** and the **"sun"** templates to the block, you can trace with water soluble pen/pencil. The sun position is **2" from the top and 1 1/4" from the right side of the block**, like on the image below. To highlight the sun with faux trapunto, place the **4" interfacing and batting squares** on the backside of the block, matching the sun's position. Pin in place and stitch the design. Cut **carefully** the excess of
