






8 At A Time (EAAT) Half-Square Triangles (HST)




Advantages: Produces eight HST units at a time and the straight of grain is on the outside edges.


Disadvantage: Due to the larger size of squares needed to make eight HSTs at a time, it can cost the quilter a little extra yardage. Example: If the fabric is only 40" wide and the cut squares are 10 1/2" x 10 1/2": Divide 40" by 10.5 and you get 3.8, or only (3) 10 1/2" squares can be cut from a strip, leaving 8 1/2" leftover.




1. Arrange 2 squares right sides together and edges even. Draw a line diagonally corner to corner in each direction using a mechanical pencil or Frixion pen.




2. Stitch 1/4" on each side of the drawn lines.



3. Cut the squares vertically and horizontally.




4. Cut the squares diagonally corner to corner.



5. Press seams to one side, usually the darker fabric.


Right Handed Trimming Instructions



Reminder:

Always place the Bloc Loc logo on the low side of each HST and lock on completely to force seams into each corner.

Left Handed Trimming Instructions



5. Place the Bloc Loc ruler on the front of the HST and lock the groove onto the seam. The groove will straighten the seam if it is locked on completely.

A. Make the first clean up cut by trimming just a sliver across the right side and then across the top.

B. Place an index finger on each corner of the ruler (you don't have to press down firmly) and turn the ruler and HST unit around until the opposite side is in position for you to trim. Do not pick up the ruler until finished trimming.

C. Trim the last two sides or slide the ruler until the measurement needed is on the trimmed edge of the HST and make the final trim.
