Wisconsin 2020-2021 School Immunization Rates and Exemption Information

- Updated in June of 2021, Wisconsin Department of Health reports that in the 2020-2021 school year,
 4.3% of parents elected to use the Personal Conviction Exemption. This is a decrease from 4.4% reported during the 2019-2020 school year.¹
- In 2020-2021, only **5.0**% of Wisconsin school children had a vaccine exemption of any type on file for one or more vaccines, which is a decrease from **5.1**% the year before.²
- The religious exemption rate has stayed at 0.4% for 3 years in a row.³
- Most parents who choose to use a vaccine exemption have children who are at least partially vaccinated. In fact, for the 2020-2021 school year, only 1.0% of students had waived all immunizations, which is a decrease of 0.2% from last school year.⁴
- A vaccine exemption is filed regardless of whether the exemption is filed for one dose or all doses.
- The Wisconsin Department of Health does not collect data to determine the exact number of vaccines or type of vaccine that are being waived by Pre-K through 12th grade students.

This is a reminder that Wisconsin state statute allows for 3 vaccine exemptions for use in Pre-K through 12th grade students, and day care: Medical, Religious, and Personal Conviction.⁵
