

WELCOME

First, a heartfelt **thank you** to **Yolanda** for graciously opening your shop to us tonight. REVIEW

Opening Reflection

Read aloud:

"I'll bring my storm-tossed, torn-sail, story-to-tell hallelujah."

We all carry stories shaped by both joy and pain—stories that are sometimes difficult to tell. Many of us have faced trauma, loss, or heartbreak so deep that the only way to cope was to **compartmentalize**—to mentally and emotionally separate our pain from our day-to-day lives just to function.

Compartmentalization can feel like survival... and often, it is.

But over time, this coping mechanism can harden into emotional detachment, numbness, or perfectionism.

- We **detach** from others and even from ourselves, unable to feel deeply or trust fully.
- We throw ourselves into work, church, or caretaking as a distraction, hoping that busyness will keep the pain buried.
- We avoid vulnerability, fear intimacy, and build emotional walls so high, even God seems far away.
- Sometimes, we convince ourselves that our pain "wasn't that bad," or that "other people have it worse"—and so we stay silent.

But here's the powerful truth:

Even when we've locked our hurt in hidden corners, **God has never turned away**. He sees every compartment we've created—and He gently knocks, not to shame us, but to **bring light into the rooms we've closed off**.

Compartmentalization may have protected us for a season, but healing begins when we invite God into the whole story—not just the polished parts.

When we bring our "storm-tossed, torn-sail, story-to-tell hallelujah," we're not glorifying our pain—we're glorifying the God who met us in it.

We're saying:

"Even in my numbness, He was near."

"Even when I built walls. He waited."

"Even in the silence, He spoke love."

Today, we begin stepping into that next brave act of faith: **telling the truth of our story**, not just for ourselves, but to encourage someone else, and to declare that **God is faithful—even when life is not easy or complete**.

Bridging Sessions 1 & 2 into Session 3: The Courage to Share Our Stories

As we step into this next session, let's take a moment to reflect on the journey we've been walking together. This study has been more than just words on a page—it's been deeply personal, spiritually refining, and, at times, challenging.

We started by learning about **worship in suffering**—how praise isn't just for the easy days. Then, we wrestled with **faith in the fire**, realizing that God is present even in our darkest moments. And now, we arrive here: the courage to share our stories.

Session 1: The Cost of Worship - Hard-Fought Praise

Think back to our first session. We talked about what it means to worship when life is falling apart.

We often associate worship with joy—singing, celebration, lifting our hands in gratitude. But what happens when worship feels like the last thing we want to do? When life feels broken, and praise feels more like a sacrifice than a song?

That's where **hard-fought praise** comes in. True worship isn't about how we feel—it's about **who God is.**

James 1:2-4 tells us that trials produce perseverance and deepen our faith.	
Isaiah 43:2 reminds us that when we walk through fire, God doesn't leave us—He wa	alks
through it with us.	

Many of us know what it's like to worship **through pain**—to stand before God with trembling hands and a weary heart, whispering, "You are still good."

And if you've ever done that, you know this truth: God meets us in those moments in a way that no mountain-top experience ever could.

Session 2: Wrestling with Darkness - Faith in the Fire

Then we moved into **faith in the fire**—the reality that faith is not the absence of struggle. In fact, **struggle refines us.**

We talked about how trials shape us, how suffering is not meaningless, and how even in the darkest moments, God is still present.

James 1:2-4 told us again: faith matures in the fire.

Revelation 12:11 reminded us that victory comes through the blood of the Lamb and the power of our testimony.

But this session wasn't just about abstract concepts—it was personal.

I shared some of my own journey...

• Walking through deep physical, emotional, and spiritual battles.

There were seasons where my own body felt like the enemy—doctors searching for answers, symptoms that no one could explain, nights filled with exhaustion and fear. I would cry out, "God, where are You in this?" And yet, through every unanswered question, **He reminded me that my strength was never in my body—it was in His grace**.

Losing my son, Elijah.

There is no grief like the loss of a child. No words can capture the depth of that pain. I wrestled with God in ways I never thought I would—*Why, Lord? How do I go on?* The grief was overwhelming, but in my **darkest days, God showed me that He wasn't distant.** He was there, grieving with me, holding me when I couldn't stand.

These moments shaped me, and maybe you have your own battles—your own **wrestling** with **God** in the fire.

That's why this truth matters: Faith doesn't mean having all the answers. Faith means holding on even when we don't understand.

Session 3: The Courage to Share Our Stories

So, here we are now. We've talked about worship in suffering and faith in the fire. Now, we step into telling our story.

Because your testimony—your real, raw, unfinished testimony—has power.

Some of us are still in the fire.

Some of us are still healing.

Some of us are still waiting for answers.

But every story, no matter how broken, is a testimony of God's grace.

So as we enter this next session, let's be bold.

Let's bring our **storm-tossed**, **torn-sail**, **story-to-tell hallelujahs** before the Lord. Because when we share our stories, **we declare victory—over fear, over doubt, and over silence**.

THIS IS

Tonight, I will be speaking on two deeply personal topics that have shaped my journey of faith.

First, I will share a brief glimpse into my life—some of the experiences, challenges, and moments that have shaped who I am today. It's not the whole story, but a window into how God has been present through every season.

Through these two stories, I pray you'll see that even in brokenness, our testimonies can shine with the hope and power of God's grace.

WRAPPING IT UP

Closing Session 3: "It Is Well" Hallelujah

But now, we take the next step in *our* journey.

The Power of Your Testimony

Revelation 12:11 – "They triumphed over him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony."

2 Corinthians 12:9-10 – "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Your testimony is not just your own—it is a **bridge** between pain and healing, not only for you but for others who need to hear it.

A Story Still Being Written

Some of us are still wrestling with unanswered prayers.

Some are still carrying grief and loss.

Some are still walking through fire.

OPEN FLOOR

But before we close, let's take a moment to hear your stories.

I want to take a moment to open the floor for anyone who feels led to share their testimony or a word of praise. Whether it's a small blessing or a life-changing moment, your story could be exactly what someone else needs to hear today.

Don't worry about it being perfect or profound—every testimony is a testament to God's goodness, no matter how simple it may seem. Let's celebrate what He's doing in our lives and encourage one another in faith.

BECAUSE "IT IS WELL"

Even when the suffering stretched on for years, I didn't bury my hallelujah. Even when the doctors had no answers, I clung to the only One who did. Even when I was too weak to stand, too broken to fight, I lifted my hallelujah with trembling hands.

I know what it feels like to compartmentalize—to lock pain away just to make it through another day. I know the exhaustion of carrying burdens too heavy to share, of hiding behind busyness and strength, hoping it will be enough to outrun the hurt.

But here's what I've learned: Even when hope seemed lost, even when I fought just to believe, I was never alone. God was in the locked places. He was in the broken places. He was in the moments when I thought my silence was safer than my surrender.

And that's why I can say with confidence: <u>My hallelujah still stands</u>. Not because the pain disappeared, not because the battle suddenly ended, but because I found a truth unshaken by storms—**God is still good**.

So no matter what comes next, no matter what I face, my hallelujah remains—scarred, battered, but victorious. Because healing didn't come from pretending I was okay. It came when I let God into the whole story—not just the polished parts.

Because it was fought for. Because it was worth it. Because every hallelujah—especially the hard-fought ones—testifies to His faithfulness.
