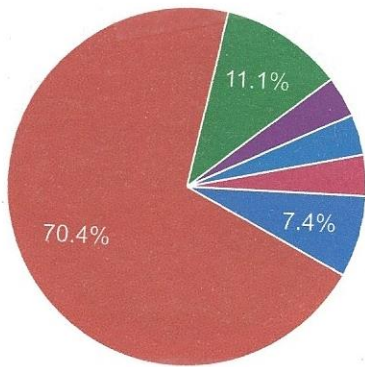

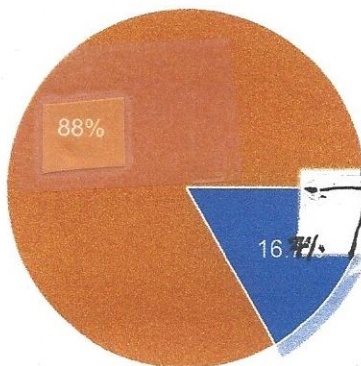

What role does your lay Tuition Assistance Committee play?



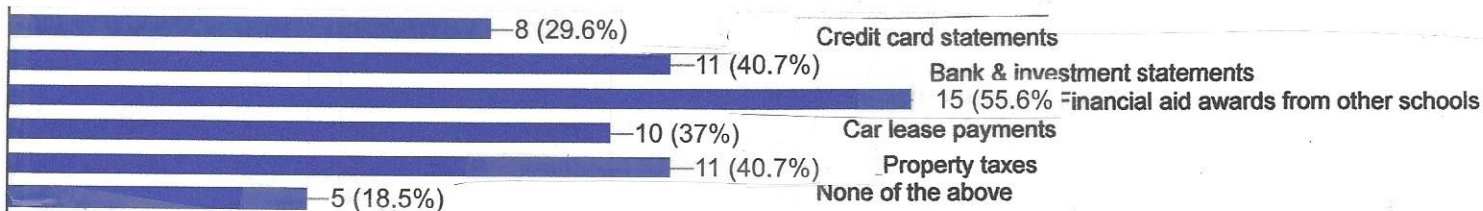
- We don't have a lay committee

- They do not read any applications. To keep the process confidential, most applications are described to them by the professional.

Does your lay committee see the names of the FA applicants?

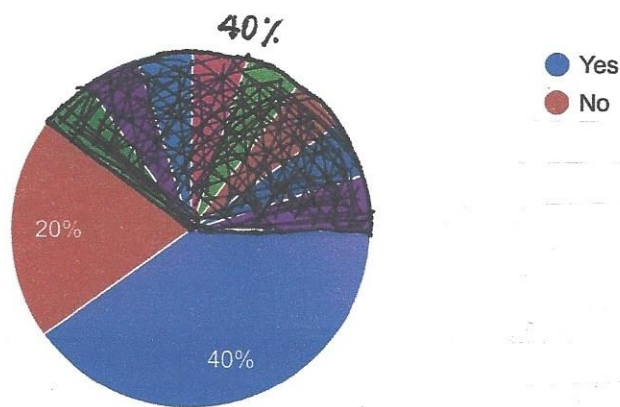


- Never

Most of it is the same with extra consideration for out of town students. Minor differences primarily based on our demographics.

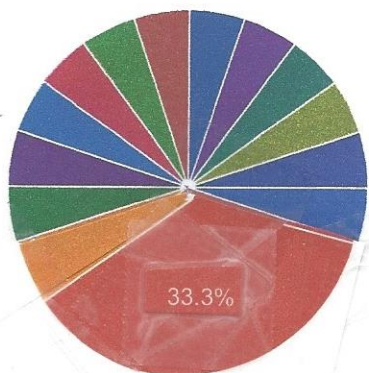
We are not consistent with this.

We treat the year in Israel, post high school, the same as elementary and HS tuition. We do NOT take into account college or grad school tuition.

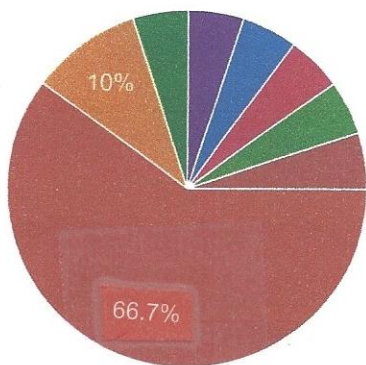
Allowance for college only for amount of city school tuition (e.g. Bklyn, Baruch, etc). We don't take college into the equation.

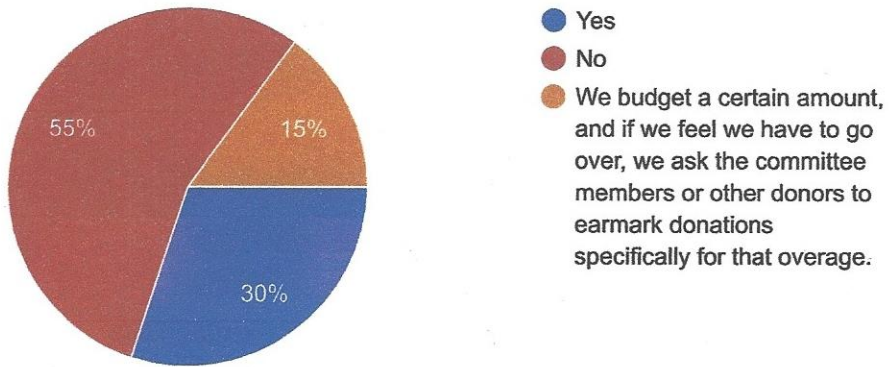

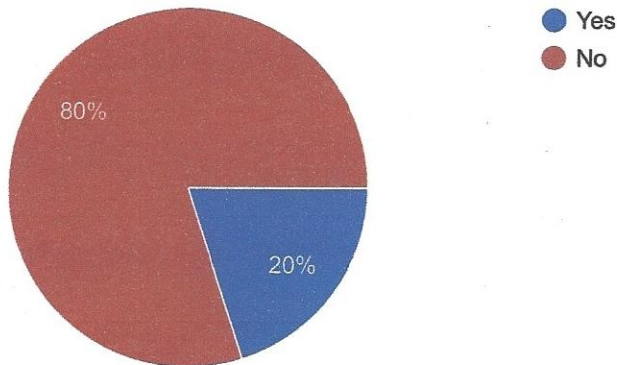

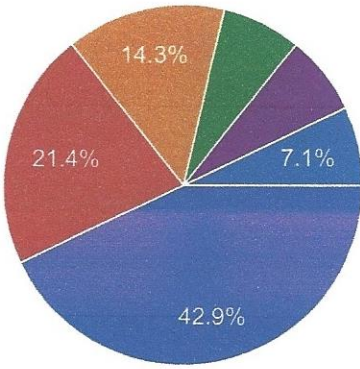
Do you have a truly fixed amount that you budget to give out each year in FA that you won't go over?



Does your school require that FA families volunteer hours on behalf of the school?

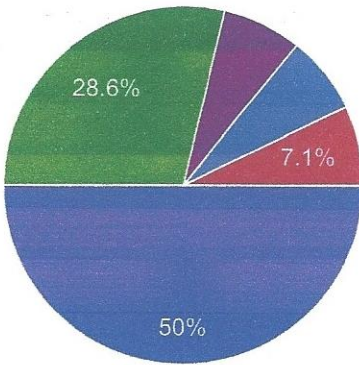


How does a family submit their application?



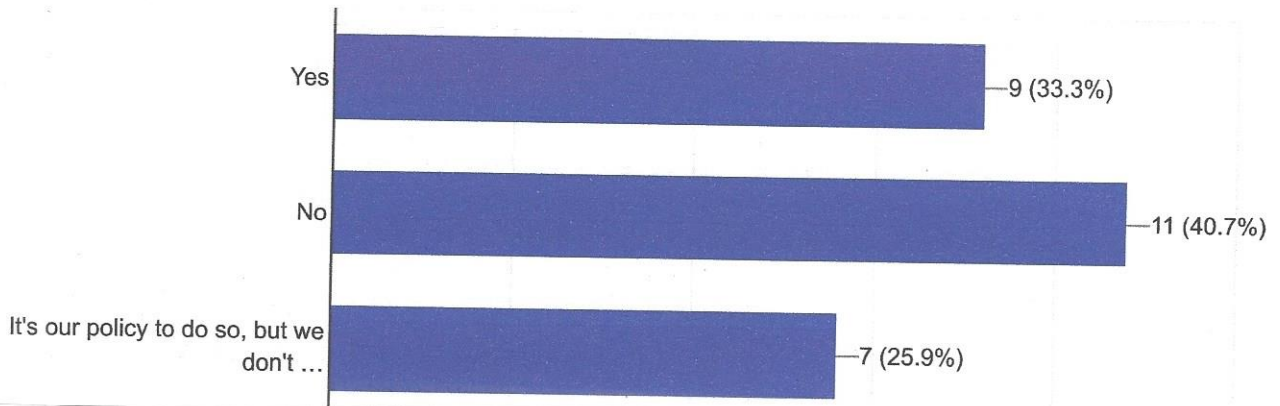
- Totally online
