Mechanical Stream


The large stones were reset so water would once again move correctly through the outflow.





Meditation Pond & Stairs

The stone wall at the edge of the pond was rebuilt to improve the aesthetics and safety of the meditation garden. The old mortared limestone retaining wall was replaced with a product called Redi-Rock and the old timber steps that lead down to the pond were replaced with Elliot limestone treads.







This summer the Resource Center (entrance to the Barbara Cox Center for Sustainable Horticulture) and grow house received new flooring and became ADA compliant with the removal of the glass doors and addition of motion-sensored sliding doors. Wayfinding now directs people from the Zorniger Education and Visitor Center through the Barbara Cox Center.

Greenhouse #1 also received the installation of a mist system for more efficient watering of seed and cutting propagation.

2019 FOUNDATION PROJECTS

Zorniger Plantings



Each year, through the generosity of a grant from the the Zorniger Family Fund of The Dayton Foundation, thousands of bulbs are added to the arboretum gardens.

This year's plantings include:

- Thirteen unique tulip varieties in a wide range of colors that will be on display in the Huffman Gallery inside the Zorniger Education & Visitor Center starting mid-February 2020.
- Narcissus, Hyacinth, Crocus, and Muscari will fill the large exterior terra cotta planters located at the exterior of the visitor center, Kettering Learning Lab, and Allée.
- Plantings at the new paver path retaining wall to include bulbs, native grasses and flowering plants.
- Additional bulb plantings throughout the grounds, for early spring color, have been added along the yellow and blue trails, mechanical stream, shrub garden entrance and meditation garden.



VOLUNTEER GROUP HIGHLIGHT

Woodworkers



The Woodworker Volunteers originally known as the "Helping Hands Crew" worked out of the basement of the Cox house in the early 1990s. In the late 1990s they moved their woodshop to their present location in the second bay of the Cox Arboretum operations building. The woodworkers meet every Thursday from 9:00-11:00 a.m.

Currently, the Woodworkers are a crew of 11 and throughout the year work on many small and large projects at the arboretum and other metroparks. Some of the projects they've worked on include: remodeling the Butterfly House, building flower planter boxes, assembling and repairing benches, trash can holders, potting benches, and remodeling the cold frames.








