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EMGLEX Announces Innovative New Virtual Conference Series

EMGLEX is pleased to announce the launch of a curated lecture series intended to provide further education specifically focused on EM topics, taught by EM specialists. The conference will be offered on the **first Thursday of each month at 11 AM CST**, and our first session will kick off on **August 4th**, **2022**. Participants will have the opportunity to learn from renowned experts from around the world, and will include physicians from such prestigious institutions as Harvard University, Brown University, University of Chicago, Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and many more.

The three-hour series will include topic based talks, a presentation from a highlighted "country of the month," and both demonstrative and interactive virtual simulation with our fellowship trained SIM experts. Since it is where it all began, we will be highlighting Italy as our first country of the month this August! Each session will conclude with a "keynote lecture," followed by a Q&A session.

After a hiatus due to COVID-19, EMGLEX is proud to announce that our flagship exchange program will be returning in-person January, 2023! Our application is attached HERE with rolling admissions into the program. We encourage residents interested in learning more about emergency medicine around the world to apply for this valuable opportunity!

Exchange Program Locations

Chicago, Illinois

The one-month rotation in Chicago for the visiting residents will consist of the below elements (Please note that all shifts will be observation-only due to US licensing regulations):

9 clinical shifts distributed between the following hospitals:

NorthShore University HealthSystem Evanston Hospital (Level 1 trauma center) University of Illinois at Chicago Hospital John H. Stroger Junior Cook County Hospital (Level 1 trauma center)

3 clinical overnight shifts working directly with Dr. Asrow, one at each of the following hospitals:

NorthShore University HealthSystem Skokie Hospital NorthShore University HealthSystem Glenbrook Hospital NorthShore University HealthSystem Highland Park Hospital

There is also the possibility of dedicated trauma shifts, ICU shifts, EMS shifts, and more.

Participants are also invited to weekly didactic conferences with EM residents from University of Chicago, UIC, Stroger/Cook County, Amita/Resurrection, and more!

Participants will also attend one-on-one SIM lab procedure training sessions, special SIM sessions depending on academic calendar, toxicology conferences, citywide resident conferences, the Illinois College of Emergency Medicine Annual Conference, the American College of Emergency Physicians Annual National Scientific Assembly, and more based on availability.



Finally, participants will enjoy meals, concerts and social events, as well as some time off to explore the city and travel!

Gainesville, Florida

We are excited to announce the addition of the University of Florida Gainesville Shands Hospital as our first satellite location of the EMGLEX flagship exchange program! The one-month rotation at the University of Florida will be comprised of the following (Please note that all shifts will be observation-only due to US licensing regulations):

6 shifts in the main ED

- 1-2 shifts at a freestanding ED
- 4 shifts dedicated to the trauma/resuscitation area
- 3 days or nights with an EM-Intensivist in an ICU
- 3 shifts with a physician response vehicle

The rotation includes a training session in the simulation center, as well as participation in resident conferences and fellowship lectures. Moreover, participants will join the medical director group providing care in the football stadium, based on availability.



The rotation will also include social activities for faculty, fellows, and residents, as well as guaranteed days off during which participants can pursue local culture, events, and local travel (e.g., Orlando, Miami). We are excited to welcome all exchange participants visiting the University of Florida!

Dr. William Weber, MD/MPH - Advisory Board Member

Dr. Weber is an Emergency Physician at the University of Chicago focusing on Global Emergency Medicine Education. He has completed a fellowship in International Emergency Medicine at the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine. He serves on the executive committee for the Global Emergency Medicine Academy (GEMA) of the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine, serves on the Public Health and Injury Prevention Committee of the American College of Emergency Physicians, and has worked as a consultant for the World Health Organization.
