#### Webmaster Report – Month of May

Flag Day is a holiday celebrated on June 14 in the United States. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The Flag Resolution stated "That the flag of the thirteen United States be

thirteen stripes, alternate red and white; that the union be thirteen stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."



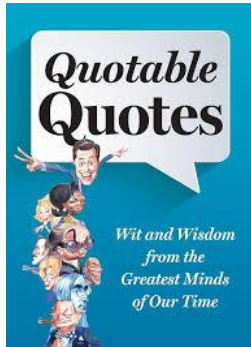
Flag Day was first proposed in 1861 to rally support for the Union side of the American Civil War. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a presidential proclamation that designated June 14 as Flag Day. On August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was officially established by an Act of Congress. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. New York Consolidated Laws designate the second Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. Federal law leaves it to the discretion of the president to officially proclaim the observance. Title 36 of the United States Code, Subtitle I, Part A, Chapter 1, Section 110 is the official statute on Flag Day. The United States Army -- founded June 14, 1775 in the immediate lead-up to the Battle of Bunker Hill as the Continental Army a year-plus before U.S. independence was declared and two years exactly before the flag's adoption by Congress -- also celebrates its birthday as June 14, 1775.

June's full Moon, the full **Strawberry Moon**, occurs on  
Monday, June 29.

It reaches peak illumination at 7:56 P.M. (EDT) that evening.



### Original Bisquick Strawberry Shortcake

#### Ingredients

##### Cake:

4 cups strawberries, stems removed and sliced  
2/3 cups sugar  
2 1/3 cups Bisquick baking mix  
1/2 cup milk  
3 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted

##### Whipped Topping:

1/2 cup whipping cream  
1 teaspoon sugar  
vanilla

In a medium bowl, mix strawberries with 1/2 cup sugar. Set aside for about an hour.

Heat oven to 425 degrees F.

In another medium bowl, stir Bisquick mix, milk, 3 tablespoons sugar, and melted butter until a soft dough forms. Drop the dough by rounded tablespoonfuls into 6 mounds onto an ungreased cookie sheet. Dust with sugar. Bake 10 to 12 minutes or until golden brown.

Meanwhile, in a small chilled bowl whip the cream, adding a drop or two of vanilla and a teaspoon of sugar. Beat with an electric mixer on high speed until soft peaks form.

Split warm shortcakes in half; fill and top with strawberries and whipped cream. OR

Break up one bisquit per person into big pieces into a dessert bowl. Ladle strawberries over the biscuit. Top with whipped cream.

Tip: raspberries, blueberries, peaches, or chopped dried apricots soaked in honey can be substituted for strawberries.
