International Workers' Day is celebrated internationally on May 1 or the first Monday in May, except in the United States and Canada. Also known as Labour Day in some countries, it is a celebration of laborers and the working classes.

May Day is also celebrated on May 1. It started in ancient Europe to mark the beginning of summer. Traditionally wildflowers were gathered and woven into garlands, May Queens were crowned, and a Maypole was erected for children to dance around. This tradition is still celebrated in many European countries.

In rural Germany, especially in the Harz Mountains, Walpurgisnacht is celebrated with bonfires and the wrapping of the Maibaum, or May Pole. In the Rhineland, May Day is celebrated with the delivery of the May Pole by men, a tree covered in streamers that is delivered to a girl the night before, typically as a love interest. In leap years, women traditionally deliver the May Pole. Most cities, towns and villages throughout Germany erect a May Pole with symbols of their lifestyle.



Memorial Day, originally known as Decoration Day, is a federal holiday celebrated in the United States to honor and mourn U.S. military personnel who died while serving in the Armed Forces. Originally May 30 was designated as the official holiday until 1971, when the last Monday of May was designated as the official day of observance. American flags are placed at the graves of these veterans by volunteers on Memorial Day.

Mother's Day is celebrated around the world, usually on the second Sunday in May. The modern form of this holiday originated in the United States. U.S. President Woodrow Wilson made it a national holiday in 1914. Traditionally a carnation is worn to honor mothers, white for mothers who have died, and red or pink for mothers who are still living. Traditionally cards and flowers are given to mothers, and even aunts and grandmothers who played motherly roles.
