Accredited formal qualifications offered and skills development training courses

Programmes Presented

Post-Literacy Programmes

These include Basic Adult Education courses for sub-levels 1-3:

- Level 1: Offers numeracy and languages (mother tongue and English, depending on the needs of the students)
- Level 2: Offers numeracy and languages and an option for of offering integrated studies or a skills programme.
- Level 3: offers numeracy and languages, integrated studies or a skills programme.

Academic Qualifications

The following academic qualifications are offered:

- General Education and Training Certificate (GETC – ABET).
- Amended Senior Certificate

To acquire a GETC-ABET qualification (NQF Level 1) provides adult learners with fundamental basics in general education learning. The purpose of this qualification is to equip learners with foundational learning by acquiring knowledge, skills and values in specified learning areas. It also allows learners to choose electives unit standards, which relate to occupational learning relevant to their area of interest or specialisation. The qualifications comprises:

- Fundamentals;
- Core; and
- Elective component.

To acquire a GETC-ABET qualification, students need to obtain a minimum of 120 credits at ABET Level 4. An achievement of 120 credits should be obtained from learning areas in the Fundamentals, Core and Elective categories according to the below rules and of combination.

Rules of Combination for the GETC-ABET Qualification: 120 Credits

Fundamentals Component: Compulsory 39 Credits:

- One Official Language: 23 credits
- Mathematical Literacy: 16 Credits OR
- Mathematics and Mathematical Sciences: 16 Credits NOT BOTH

Core Component: Compulsory 32 Credits

- Life Orientation: 32 credits

Electives Component: Optional/Choice 51 Credits

- **Academic Learning Areas:**
- Human and Social Sciences: 23 Credits

- Natural Sciences: 15 Credits
- Economic and Management Sciences: 21 Credits
- Arts and Culture: 17 Credits
- Technology: 11 Credits
- One Additional Language (Excluding the language chosen as a Fundamental): 23 Credits
- **Vocational Learning Areas:**
 - Applied Agriculture and Agricultural Technology: 20 Credits
 - Ancillary Health Care: 45 Credits
 - Small, Medium and Micro Enterprises: 17 Credits
 - Travel and Tourism: 38 Credits
 - Information Communication Technology: 23 Credits
 - Early childhood Development: 26 Credits
 - Wholesale and Retail 37 Credits

TWO Fundamentals, ONE Core and TWO Electives

Option 2:6 Learning Areas

TWO Fundamentals, ONE Core and THREE Electives

Option 3:7 or more Learning Areas

TWO Fundamentals, ONE Core and FOUR Electives

Entrance Requirements

- Certified Identity Document
- Proof of Resident
- All Perspective students will write a placement assessment to be placed in the correct level.

Amended Senior Certificate in selected CLC's

The need for a Qualification for Adults that is equivalent to the current National Senior Certificate (NSC), The Minister of Basic Education has approved the (SC) Qualification such that it can be offered by students who will have no alternative route to follow post June 2014 Senior Certificate. The Senior Certificate retains its Qualification structure but will utilize the National Curriculum Statement (NCS) Subjects to support the Qualification. This implies that the Curriculum & Assessment Policy Statement (CAPS) Subjects will be offered as part of the Senior Certificate. All Senior Certificate Subjects that were passed prior to June 2015, at Higher Grade & Standard Grade excluding Lower Grade, will be recognized.

Entrance Requirements

South African Citizens

- A person must be 21 years or older;
- Certified copy of ID;
- Proof of Residence
- Certified copy of previous results/school report (Passed GETC – NQF 1)
- Person with an incomplete National Senior Certificate and whose school-Based Assessment (SBA) Validity has expired.
- Only in exceptional cases, out of school youth, who are 18-21 years old and who could not complete their school education due to circumstances beyond their control, as verified by the Head of the Mpumalanga Department of Education.

Non-South African Citizens

- Certified copy of Passport or study permit;
- Copy of previous results or highest qualification (endorsed by the South African Qualification Authority); and
- Proof of Address
