



fall DRIVING TIPS



WEATHER & ROADS

- RAIN & WET LEAVES → WET LEAVES ACT LIKE ICE; INCREASE STOPPING DISTANCE.
- FOGGY MORNINGS → MAKE SURE HEADLIGHTS/TAILLIGHTS ARE CLEAN AND WORKING.
- SHORTER DAYS → MORE DRIVING IN THE DARK, SO CHECK BULBS AND AIM OF HEADLIGHTS.
- TEMPERATURE SWINGS → WARM DAYS AND COLD NIGHTS = TIRE PRESSURE FLUCTUATIONS



VEHICLE READINESS

- WINDSHIELD CARE → REPLACE WIPERS BEFORE THE FIRST HEAVY RAIN OR FROST.
- DEFROSTERS/HEATER → ENSURE THEY WORK TO PREVENT FOGGY WINDOWS.
- CHECK SEALS & WEATHERSTRIPPING → COLD + MOISTURE CAN SNEAK IN THROUGH WORN SEALS.
- FUEL TANK → KEEP IT AT LEAST HALF FULL TO AVOID CONDENSATION BUILDUP.



SAFETY & PREPAREDNESS

- EMERGENCY SUPPLIES → BLANKETS, GLOVES, FLASHLIGHT, SCRAPER, UMBRELLA.
- WILDLIFE COLLISIONS → DEER ARE MORE ACTIVE IN FALL (ESPECIALLY DUSK/DAWN).
- SLIPPERY ROADS AT DAWN/DUSK → WATCH FOR BLACK ICE AS TEMPS DROP OVERNIGHT.
