The goal of Adult Learning Principles: Structures and Strategies for Presenting and Facilitating is to provide an introduction to skills, concepts, protocols, and capabilities necessary to promote and sustain group collaboration.



Adult Learning Principles (2 Days)

The two-day learning series is designed to deepen participants' understanding of the skills and dispositions essential for effectively leading adult learning. Throughout the experience, participants will explore research-based strategies and practical approaches that cultivate a strong culture of instruction and continuous learning.

By the end of the training, participants will leave with a clear, practical understanding of how to leverage effective communication skills to enhance learning outcomes for both educators and students.

During the two-day sessions, participants will develop:

- Increased capacity to design and implement planning procedures, protocols, and structures that build and sustain high-performing teams
- Expanded repertoire of practical facilitation, presentation, and coaching tools
- Action-oriented strategies to keep group members focused, engaged, energized, and resourceful
- Refined skills and dispositions to move groups beyond surface-level consensus toward shared purpose, deeper thinking, and meaningful learning
