

Hebrews 1

Hebrews 1:1-14 (NIV2011)

¹ In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, ² but in these last days (**1 Peter 1:20**) he has spoken to us by his Son (**Matt 3:17**), whom he appointed heir (**Ps 2:8; Matt 11:27 & Matt 28:18**) of all things, and through whom also he made the universe [*the Ages*](**John 1:3; Heb 11:3**).

³ The Son is the radiance of God’s glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining [*upholding*] (**Col 1:17**) all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins [*cleansing*] (**Titus 2:14; Heb 8:1; 10:12**), he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven (**Mark 16:19**).

⁴ So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs (**Eph 1:21**). ⁵ For to which of the angels did God ever say, “You are my Son; today I have become your Father” (**Ps 2:7; Acts 13:33; Heb 5:5**)? Or again, “I will be his Father, and he will be my Son” (**2 Sam 7:14**)?

⁶ And again, when God brings his firstborn into the world, he says, “Let all God’s angels worship him. (**Ps 97:7 Dead Sea Scrolls & Septuagint**)” ⁷ In speaking of the angels he says, “He makes his angels spirits (*like the wind*; **Ps 104:4**), and his servants (*public servants*) flames of fire. (**Ps 148:8**)”

⁸ But about the Son he says, “Your throne, O God (**Ps 45:6**), will last for ever and ever; a scepter of justice will be the scepter of your kingdom. ⁹ You have loved righteousness and hated wickedness (**Ps 45:7**); therefore God, your God, has set you above your companions by anointing you with the oil of joy.”

¹⁰ He also says, “In the beginning, Lord, you laid the foundations of the earth and the heavens are the work of your hands(**Ps 102:25**). ¹¹ They will perish, but you remain (**Ps 102:26**); they will all wear out like a garment (**Isa 51:6; Ps 102:27**). ¹² You will roll them up like a robe; like a garment they will be changed. But you remain the same, and your years will never end.”

¹³ To which of the angels did God ever say, “Sit at my right hand until I make your enemies a footstool for your feet” (**Ps 110:1; Matt 22:44; Heb 1:3; Josh 10:24; Heb 10:13**)?

¹⁴ Are not all angels [**Angelos**] ministering (**Public Servants**) spirits (**like the wind**) sent to serve (**as Deacons**) those who will inherit salvation (**Matt 25:34; Titus 3:7**)?
