



#10 Will Richardson

6-3 Jr. Guard Fordham

2024 — Played in every game as a freshman and was the team's second leading scorer as a sophomore. Posted the best three-point percentage in the last 17 years for Rams. Prepped at Bergen Catholic leading them to three state championships. Finished as the school's all-time leading scorer. Named the New Jersey State Player of the Year and ranked the 21st best combo guard in the nation.



#00 Avery Brown

6-4 Jr. Guard Columbia
2024 — Columbia's assist leader back-to-back seasons. A two-time Ivy
Rookie of the Week selection. Prepped at Northfield Mount Herman where
he was named first-team all NEPSAC. Rated one of the nations Top-150
players by Rivals.com and a four-star recruit by 247Sports.com. Earned four
varsity letters and led the Hoggers to the 2022 National Championship game.





#22 Teyvien Barbour

6-4 Fr. Guard Harvard

2024 — Rated one of the top players in the state of Virginia. Prepped at Patriot High where he led the team to a 24-4 record and the regional championship. Two-time Cedar Run Conference Player of the Year, Region 6 Player of the Year, and All Met first-team. Scored over 1,500 career points with a single game high of 46.





#01 Darrick Jones

6-5 Sr. Guard Le Moyne

2024 — Consistent threat from behind the arc, combined with high-flying athleticism, Jones averaged 40% from three and 80% at the line. Helped lead Le Moyne to two Northeast-10 Conference Championship games. Arrived from Towson where he helped the Tigers win the CAA regular season title and NIT. Three-star by ESPN.com, #8 in Virginia, and top 50 nationally.





#03 Cameron Gallon

6-4 Sr. Guard Western Connecticut

2024 — Led the Wolves to a 22-5 record and the LEC Championship game. An LEC All-Conference Selection. Was named an Honorable Mention All-Metropolitan selection among all collegiate players in New York, New Jersey, and Connecticut. Gallon finished his junior season the team's leader in three pointers made and three-point field goal percentage.





#05 Jaden Cooper

6-3 Sr. Guard Columbia
2024 — Appeared in all 27 games with a career high 26 points against
Harvard. Shot 38% from three on the season with a 49 assist to 19 turnover
ratio. Prepped at Wayne Country Day where he was named the Coastal Plains
Independent Conference Player of the Year. Three-time all-conference player
and a three-time NCISAA all-state selection.





#02 Josh Rivera

6-6 Jr. Forward Fordham
2024 — Appeared in 29 games for the Rams. Transfer from Lafayette where he was a Patriot League All-Rookie selection. In Rivera's last 15 contests he averaged 16 points and 7 rebounds per game, including a high of 27. In that stretch he posted two double-doubles and lead the team to the

2024 — An ECC All-Conference selection each of his three seasons. Led the Dolphins in scoring, rebounding, blocks, and free throws last season. As a sophomore was Player of the Week, Defensive Player of the Week, All-Conference, and All-Metropolitan for a second time. In his first year was an eight-time Rookie of the Week, Conference and College Rookie of the Year.

6-7 Fr. Forward Central Connecticut

2024 — Redshirt freshman at Central for a twenty-win program and an anticipated immediate impact for the Blue Devils in 24-25. Prepped at Vermont Academy in the famed NEPSAC conference where he averaged 12ppg, 5rpg, and 41% from three-point range. Attended Springfield Central where, as a sophomore, led his team to a 22-1 mark and the State Championship.

6-8 Gr. Forward Keene State
