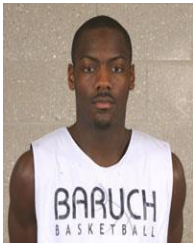


### #01 Greg Sprink

6-4 Jr. Guard Navy



2005 — Named to the 2005 Patriot League Men's Basketball All-Rookie Team ... played in 24 of the 28 games in his rookie season and started each of the last 19 contests ... produced his first-collegiate double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds at Mount St. Mary's Dec. 21 ... named Patriot League Rookie of the Week ... named Patriot League Rookie of the Week for the second time when he scored a career-high 22 points which included six three-pointers at Lafayette (Jan. 8) ... led Navy in scoring, rebounding, assists (tied) and steals (tied) ... Attended El Camino High School in Oceanside, Calif. ... Led El Camino to the 2003 CIF San Diego Championship with a 31-3 record.

In his second season, he averaged 11 points and six assists ... The six assists was second best in the City University of New York Athletic Conference ... Played two years for longtime coach Tommy Allen at Canarsie High School in Brooklyn...Named to the New York City Wheelchair Classic Team in 2002.

2005-06 — Reserve point guard played in 27 games, averaging 13.4 minutes per contest ... Owned an assist-to-turnover ratio of 2.4 on the season... Attended Notre Dame Preparatory School as a fifth-year player during the 2004-05 season averaging 16 points and seven assists ... Second-team All-Prep by Scout.com ... Top-50 Prep by Hoop Scoop ... Notre Dame posted a 23-12 record, playing one of the toughest schedules in the country... Attended Lake Clifton-Eastern High School,...Averaged 16 points, eight assists, six rebounds and two steals as a senior leading Lake Clifton-Eastern to a 19-5 record.

Played on the Team Georgia Elite AAU team, where he averaged 15 points per game.

In high school Grant ranked among top 50 shooting guards in the country by InsidersHoop.com...selected to McDonalds All-American honorable mention team...also listed as honorable mention All-America by 2002-03 Street & Smith's Magazine...named outstanding performer of 2003 Washington Catholic Athletic Association All-Star game after collecting 20 points and 10 rebounds, while also winning the slam dunk contest... lead Paul VI to best season in school history 22-7.

Led his team to a 22-2 record during his senior year and was ranked No. 44 on the Top 100 seniors list by FoxSports.com. He also garnered All-Met honors from The Washington Post.
