#**10 Ethan Lee** 6-2 Sr. Guard Lycoming

2010 — Coming off of a 2010 NCAA Tournament appearance, this senior shooting guard was Lycoming's top marksman. Shot a team high 58% from the field and knocked down 62% of his three point attempts, also a team high. A three year letterman, Lee is a legitimate three point weapon in the Warriors offensive system. He is a graduate of Mifflinburg High School where he was a standout athlete in basketball.



#11 Will Kelly 6-4 Sr. Forward Lycoming

2010 — Senior captain has started in 52 straight games. Helped the 2009-2010 Warriors get back to the NCAA Tournament for the schools fifth time. Kelly led Lycoming to a 21-7 record by scoring 15.6 points and grabbing 7.1 rebounds per contest. He was a three sport athlete at Loyalsock High School winning district championships in basketball and baseball while being named all state in football.



#12 Nick Russell
6-4 So. Guard Kansas State

Kansas State University

2010 — Appeared in 21 contests in his freshman season, helping his team to a 29-8 record in route to the NCAA Elite 8. His his first college appearance Russell showed his ability to score by posting 10 points in 13 minutes. Regarded in high school as one of the top guards in the country...Ranked among the top-40 at his position, including No. 21 by *Rivals.com* and No. 38 by *ESPN Scouts, Inc.*



#14 Scott Martin6-8 Jr. Forward Notre Dame

2010 — Transferred to Notre Dame in 2008 after playing one season at Purdue. Played in 32 of Purdue's 34 games and made eight starts on a Boilermaker team that finished with a 25-9 record and a 15-3 mark in the Big Ten. Martin finished seventh on the all-time freshman list for most three-point field goals in a season (24), as well as tenth in highest free-throw percentage (.701) and eighth most steals (30).



#15 Sebastian Sabella6-5 Sr. Guard Lycoming

2010 — Senior captain coming off of a 21-7 season. Helped the Warriors reach the conference final two of his three years, including the teams 5th NCAA Tournament. Sabella's versatility gives opponents significant matchup problems. He scored 17 points in just 11 minutes on December 20th and followed that performance by scoring 9 points in 11 minutes to seal the Warriors semi-final playoff win on February 24th.



#23 Lewis Jackson5-9 Jr. Guard Purdue

2010 — A 2009 Big Ten All Freshman selection, leading the team in assists with 118. Started in 30 of 36 contests.

Posted eight points and nine assists in the 1st Round of the 09-10 NCAA Tournament (3rd best assist mark in Purdue history). Was named the 2008 Big School Player of the Year by MidStateHoops.com, averaging 21.7 points and 10 assists per contest in his senior season.



#24 Paris Horne6-3 Sr. Guard St. John's

2010 — Started in 32 of St. John's 33 contests. A first team All-Met selection by the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association (MBWA) who averaged 16.1 points per game in BIG EAST play for the Red Storm. Prepped at Bridgton Academy where his team went 34-5 and was rated the #1 Prep School team in the country. Rated by numerous publications as a Top 30 shooting guard in the nation.



#**30 Jeff Peterson** 6-0 Jr. Guard Arkansas

2010 — A junior in his first season with the Razorbacks. Spent two years at the University of Iowa, starting in 25 contests his sophomore season prior to a hamstring injury. Led the Hawkeyes in assists, was second in steals, and averaged 10.4 points per game. Played at national power DeMatha High School in Washington DC where he was First Team All Conference on a team ranked as high as #2 in the country.



#32 Jamar Samuels

6-7 Jr. Forward Kansas State



2010 — This year's recipient of the Big 12 and *Yahoo! Sports*... 6th Man on the Year Award. A big part of Kansas State's run into the Elite 8 of the 2010 NCAA Tournament. Led the team in scoring three times in his freshman season and was top five in twelve statistical categories. As a sophomore was top five in nine of those same categories. Prepped at The Patterson School where his team finished 36-4, ranking #3 in the nation.



#**42 Keith Wright**6-8 Jr. Forward Harvard

2010 — The Crimson's leading shot blocker and one of their top field goal percentage shooters this season. Was named Ivy League Rookie of the Week twice and recorded a double double in his first season as well. In high school Wright was a two-time all state selection, averaging 20 points and 13 rebounds per contest. He scored 30 or more points five times and posted two triple doubles as a senior.
