6-0 Jr. Guard Kansas State



2008-09 — A three year starter at Proviso East High School, Pullen was rated one of the Top 20 points guards in the country his senior season, leading his team to a 27-4 record. He averaged 22 points, 8 assists, and 6 steals per contest. Saw action in all 33 games as a freshman, scoring in 32 of them, and putting up double digits in 17 of those games. Placed in the leagues top 10 for freshman in scoring, steals, and assists.



#01 Corey Chandler6-2 Jr. Guard Rutgers

2008-09 — A dynamic athlete with highlight reel abilities at both ends of the floor. Was selected to the Big East All Rookie Team in 2007-2008, Chandler had 51 steals that year, the most for a freshman in Rutgers Basketball history. Scored in double figures 18 times, he led the team in scoring during league play at 10.5 points per contest.



#02 Cam Thoroughman6-7 So. Forward West Virginia

2008-09 — The poster-child for versatility. Thoroughman has shown to be an excellent perimeter shooter, solid passer, strong on the glass, and an all around tough player with a nose for the ball. Averaged 22 points, 13 rebounds, and 4 assists in high school. Cam just completed his first full season after knee surgery in summer 2008, averaged 10 minutes a game in 33 of the Mountaineers 35 contests this season.



#13 Arjun Ohri6-3 Jr. Guard Polytechnic

2008-09 — Ohri finished his sophomore season as one of the top 10 scorers and top 5 free throw shooters in the country, at the division III level. Averaging 23 pts, 4 rbs and 4 asts per contest, he earned All Conference Honors while shooting 93% from the line and 40% from three. A New Jersey native, Ohri attended Bridgewater Raritan HS, where his team went 22-7, winning 3 straight county titles.





2008-09 — A two year starter at national power The Patterson School. Helped his team to a 36-4 record and a rank of #3 in the nation. Rated the 11th best small forward in the nation as a senior, Sutton averaged 15 pts. 8 rbs. and 3 stl. per contest. In his 1st start at K-State Sutton helped his team upset #2 Kansas. As a sophomore he started 32 of 34 contests averaging 8 pts and 5 rbs while shooting 49% from the floor.



#23 Patrick Jackson6-6 So. Forward Rutgers

2008-09 — Arrived on campus at Rutgers ranked the 28th best small forward in the nation by ESPN. Jackson, combined with the rest of his 2008 teammates, had Rutgers rated the 19th best recruiting class in the nation. Selected for the Jordan Brand All Star Game out of high school, Jackson poured in 20 points at Madison Square Garden in that game. This NYC wing is known to be one of the top shooters around.



#24 James Oberlies6-3 Sr. Guard Lycoming

2008-09 — Posted 41 assists and 37 steals in his junior campaign. A winner of the "Nails Award" in his sophomore season, Oberlies helped lead the Warriors to the 2007-2008 regular season conference championship. A recipient of the Coaches Award and an All-Academic Selection, Oberlies' winning ways stem from the tradition of his alma mater, St. Joseph Prep HS (Philadelphia, PA).



#25 Darryl "Truck" Bryant 6-2 So. Guard West Virginia

2008-09 — Bryant stepped in and contributed immediately for West Virginia averaging 10 points and 3 assists in 35 contests as a freshman this year. Known as "Truck" for his physical nature and ability to get to the rim, Bryant can play either guard position. This NYC product set the scoring record at national power St. Raymond's HS and was selected in 2007 to attend the NBA Top 100 Camp.



#32 Michael Bradley6-7 So. Forward Lycoming



2008-09 — A bull around the rim, Bradley is a physical post player with the ability to step out and shoot to 15 feet. Playing in 23 of 24 games as a freshman, he is expected to become a key part of the Warrior offense for 2009-2010. Played for legendary Coach Speedy Morris at St. Joseph Prep in Philadelphia, Bradley was an All Conference Selection in both football and basketball.



#33 Chris Kehoe 6-4 So. Forward

Conn. College

2008-09 — Selected All Conference his final two years, Kehoe played all four of his high school years at the varsity level. Chris' athleticism had him start at the center position for the Connecticut College Camels in 08-09 averaging 5 pts and 5 rbs per game, extending defenses by his ability to shoot the three. He is expected to slide back to his natural SF/PF position in 2009-2010.



#51 Joe Latas6-11 Fr. Center Cleveland State



2008-09 — Deemed "The Big Man of The Future" for Cleveland State University, this red shirt freshman is expected to be a major contributor to the team in 2009-2010. Prior to college, Latas proved to be a dominant post at the high school level, averaging 22 points, 15 rebounds, and 4 blocks per game. Was named the #2 post player in the state of Ohio by PrepSpotlight.com.
