

**#0 Jimmy Boeheim**

6-8 Sr. Forward Syracuse

2021- Jimmy transferred this summer to Syracuse from Cornell for his 5th year. In his junior season at Cornell, he finished 5th in the conference in scoring (16.7) and 10th in rebounding (5.6). Jimmy had four consecutive 20-point games which was tied for the fifth-longest streak at Cornell since 1976. Prior to Cornell, Jimmy played at Jamesville Dewitte HS where he was an all-Central New York selection, before prepping at New Hampton School.

**#1 Matthew Turner**

6-3 Jr. Guard Western Conn. St.

2021- Matthew's season was cancelled due to Covid, but he comes into his senior year as a skillful, 3-level scorer who can create off the catch and dribble. Before transferring, he played at Santa Clara and Marist where he shot 34% from three. He spent his final 2 seasons of high school at Blair Academy where he earned First Team All-Conference and All-State honors.

**#3 Dajuan Harris Jr.**

6-1 So. Guard Kansas

2021- After redshirting for a year, Dajuan showcased his great defensive instincts and ability to create on offense. Dajuan was 2nd on the team in assists (65) and his 29 steals were tops among non-starters. Before Kansas, Dajuan guided Rock Bridge High School to the 2018-19 Class 5 state championship and is his school's all-time leader in assists and steals.

**#4 Paul Mulcahy**

6-6 Jr. Guard Rutgers

2021- Paul is an unselfish guard known for his high basketball IQ and winning reputation. Mulcahy showcases this by filling up the stat sheet, helping his team wherever is needed as he averaged 5.9 points, 3.4 rebounds, and 2.9 assists per game this past season. He attended Gill St Bernard (NJ) where he was the first New Jersey High School boys' basketball player to average a triple-double in 26 years.

**#5 Matthew Kelly**

5-10 Sr. Guard Assumption

2021- Entering his senior season, Matthew started all 26 games the prior season, leading his team in scoring (16.1) for the 3rd year in a row. Matthew surpassed 1,000 career points and was named to the NE10 Conference Third Team. He attended Quince Orchard High School, leading his team to the state finals while being named First-Team All-County and Fourth-Team All-State.

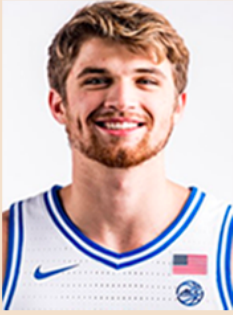




#10 Alyn Breed

6-3 So. Guard Providence

2021- Alyn made an immediate impact as a freshman at Providence, scoring 5.0 points per game off the bench. He showcased his competitiveness on both sides of the floor in his 18 point, 11 rebound performance against No. 3 Villanova. Before Providence, Alyn played at McEachern High School who he helped to a 32-0 record and a No. 1 national ranking.



#13 Joey Baker

6-6 Sr. Forward Duke

2021- Joey enters his senior season as a key contributor off Duke's bench. He appeared in 23 games for the Blue Devils while making 16 three pointers and logging a season high of 12 points in a win at Wake Forest. Joey was a 5 star recruit by ESPN for the class of 2019 before reclassifying to 2018. He attended Trinity Christian School where he was on pace to be his class salutatorian before reclassifying and attending Duke early.



#21 Evan Battey

6-8 Sr. Forward Colorado

2021 - Evan returns for his senior season as the team's leader in points (10.3) and rebounds (5.3) while also leading the team in free throws made (104) and attempted (126). He named honorable mention All-Pac-12 while leading the team to the NCAA tournament and a win against Georgetown. Prior to Colorado, Evan was a graduate of Villa Park High School and was rated the No. 17 post player in the nation by ESPN.



#22 Patrick McCaffery

6-9 So. Forward Iowa

2021- This past season, Patrick played a key role off the bench, appearing in every game while averaging 5.2 points and 2.7 rebounds per contest. He was playing his best basketball at the end of the season shooting at least 50% in five of Iowa's last six contests, including all four postseason games. Prior to college, Patrick was ranked 60th on ESPN's top 100 list and is his high school's all-time leading scorer.



#35 Buddy Boeheim

6-6 Sr. Guard Syracuse

2021- Buddy enters his senior season at Syracuse after leading the team in scoring (17.8). He earned All-ACC Tournament 1st team honors, set a Syracuse record for points in an ACC Tournament game (31), and led Syracuse to the Sweet 16. Prior to Syracuse, Boeheim played at Jamesville Dewitte HS where he scored 40 points in the NYSPHSAA Class A Quarterfinals before prepping at Brewster Academy (NH).
