

INVITATION TO THE PRESS AND STAKEHOLDERS ABOUT "WE WANT TO KEEP EUROPEAN CITIZENSHIP"

Brussels, 22 November 2018, 11:00 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Fondation Universitaire, Rue d'Egmont 11, 1000 Brussels, Belgium

This is the demand made so far by nearly 100,000 people who have been quick to sign the initiative on permanent European citizenship. The majority are from the UK, but signatures have been coming in too from every EU Member State showing that at a time of resurgent nationalism there is popular support for EU citizenship. Questions for debate:

- What should be done before the deadline for signature collection next July (and earlier in the UK) to increase the total to 1 million and achieve the required threshold in at least seven Member states?
- Should European citizenship shrink overnight by 65 million with UK withdrawal from the EU or is BREXIT on the contrary an opportunity for a more inclusive citizenship for the European continent? (you can find ECIT background paper here)

He is the author of the book "Piecing together Europe's citizenship".
- Dr. Alexandra von Westernhagen is an English and German qualified solicitor who has been specialising in EU law for over 20 years. For the past 12 years, she has been commuting between Brussels (where she currently lives with her family, composed of four EU nationalities) and London (where she heads up the EU law team of international law firm DAC Beachcroft LLP).
