What is Tuberculosis (TB)?

TB is an infectious disease that is passed on when a person with tuberculosis of the lungs, coughs and another person inhales the germ that causes TB (mycobacterium tuberculosis).

Untreated TB is a life-threatening illness. HIV positive people are most at risk of developing TB. One case of TB can be devastating for workers, their families, and workplaces. In PNG there strains of multi-drugresistant (MDR) and extensively-drugresistant (XDR) TB which do not respond to regular TB treatment. Cases of drug-resistant TB are harder to manage and take longer to treat. Businesses can learn to play a vital role in early detection and treatment adherence, which prevents the development of drug-resistant TB.

This course teaches participants of your TB team, the skills and knowledge required to deliver TB awareness, assist staff to find possible cases, access free TB services and support an employee with TB at each stage of testing, and treatment and return-to-work pathway. Cost: K1500 pp for additional TB team members.
