


Progress of Implementing the Sustainable Development Goals


- Second NDC launched in December 2020 by Hon. Wera Mori, Minister for Environment, Conservation and Climate Change
- Contains quantifiable targets for stakeholders to focus on achieving
- Meeting these NDC targets requires collaboration and inputs from all stakeholders, including private sector and SMEs
- CCDA with support from UNDP has developed the National Action Plan to articulate how the NDC targets will be achieved

UN Global Compact



In July 2000, United Nations Secretary-General Kofi Annan put forth the vision of "a global compact of shared values and principles, which will give a human face to the global market." Since then, UN Global Compact has grown from a group of 44 businesses into what it is today, the world's largest corporate sustainability initiative and a global movement of more than 12,000 businesses and 3,000 non-business stakeholders across more than 160 countries.

Target 12.5 By 2030, substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse
