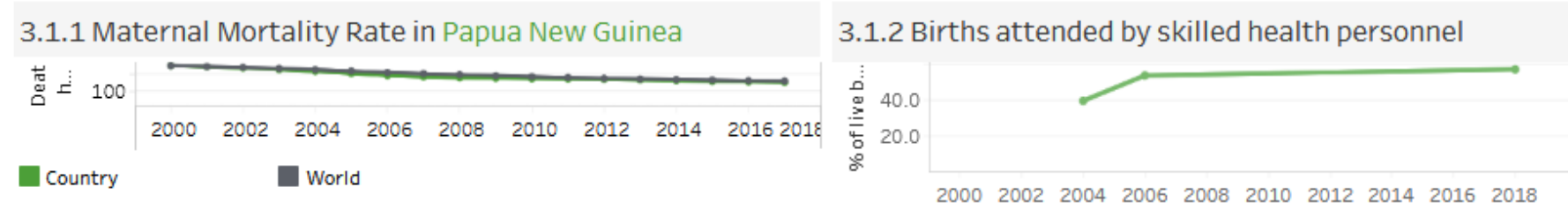

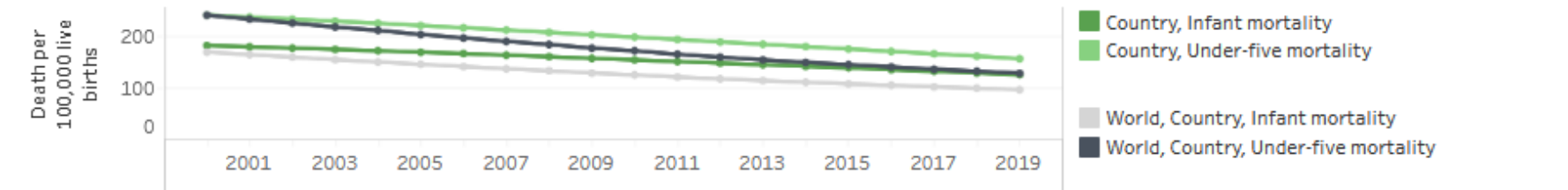

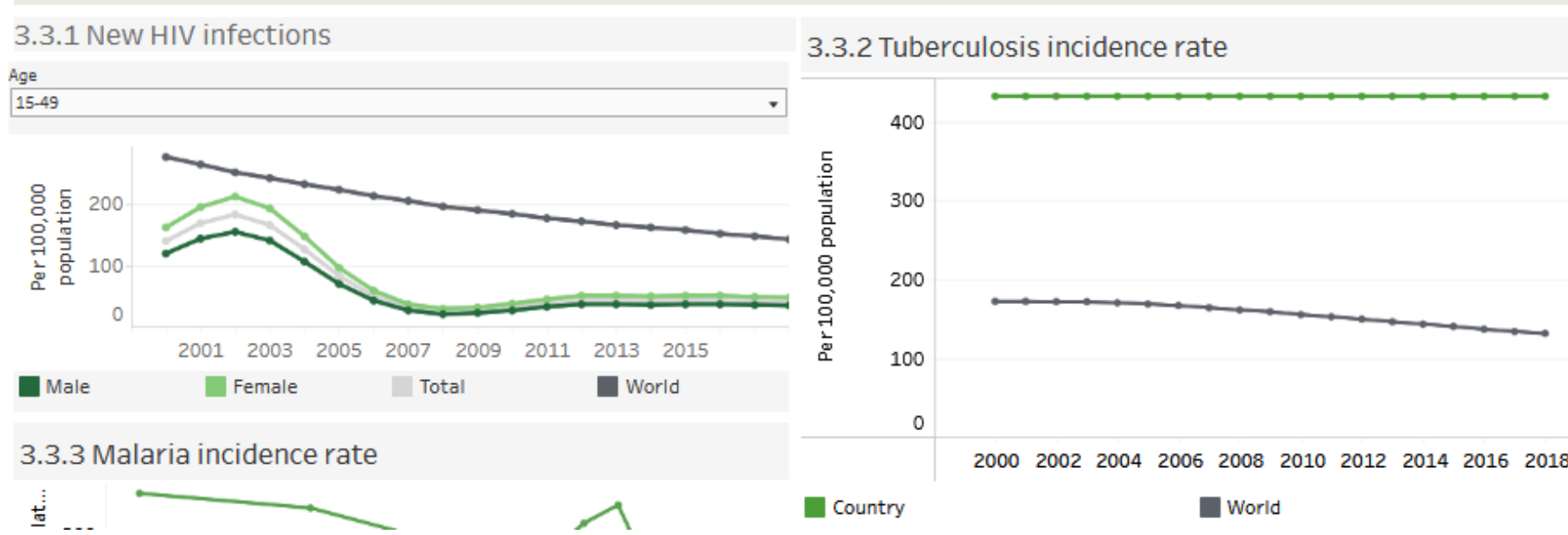

## Papua New Guinea's Enhanced Nationally Determined Contribution 2020



- ❖ 2015 Paris Agreement
- ❖ Second NDC launched in December 2020 by Hon. Wera Mori, Minister for Environment, Conservation and Climate Change
- ❖ Contains quantifiable targets for stakeholders to focus on achieving
- ❖ Meeting these NDC targets requires collaboration and inputs from all stakeholders, including private sector and SMEs
- ❖ CCDA with support from UNDP has developed the National Action Plan to articulate how the NDC targets will be achieved

# UN Global Compact



In July 2000, United Nations Secretary-General Kofi Annan put forth the vision of “a global compact of shared values and principles, which will give a human face to the global market.” Since then, UN Global Compact has grown from a group of 44 businesses into what it is today, the world’s largest corporate sustainability initiative and a global movement of more than 12,000 businesses and 3,000 non-business stakeholders across more than 160 countries.

## THE TEN PRINCIPLES OF THE UNITED NATIONS GLOBAL COMPACT



### HUMAN RIGHTS

1. Businesses should support and respect the protection of internationally proclaimed human rights; and
2. make sure that they are not complicit in human rights abuses.



### LABOUR

3. Businesses should uphold the freedom of association and the effective recognition of the right to collective bargaining;
4. the elimination of all forms of forced and compulsory labour;
5. the effective abolition of child labour; and
6. the elimination of discrimination in respect of employment and occupation.



### ENVIRONMENT

7. Businesses should support a precautionary approach to environmental challenges;
8. undertake initiatives to promote greater environmental responsibility; and
9. encourage the development and diffusion of environmentally friendly technologies.



### ANTI-CORRUPTION

10. Businesses should work against corruption in all its forms, including extortion and bribery.

❖ **SDG 10:**

**Target 10.3** *Ensure equal opportunity and reduce inequalities of outcome, including by eliminating discriminatory laws, policies and practices and promoting appropriate legislation, policies and action in this regard*

❖ **SDG 12:**

**Target 12.5** *By 2030, substantially reduce waste generation through prevention, reduction, recycling and reuse*

- ❖ UN is a recognized neutral partner that uses its convening power to bring stakeholders together to tackle development challenges
- ❖ UN has access to global and regional knowledge and expertise that can be shared with PNG networks to support the country's development and progress on the SDGs
