


Papua New Guinea HIV & AIDS FACTSHEET 2024








FAST TRACK TARGETS

Globally, new HIV infections have declined by 39% since 2010. In Papua New Guinea, infections have increased 101%. However, with increased coverage of ART, HIV-related deaths have remained stable.



HIV PROGRAM IMPACT

Since 2010, ART treatment coverage has averted

33,300 deaths in Papua New Guinea.

Since 2010, 2,600 new infections have been averted by PMTCT.

The HIV prevalence rate in PNG is 1% - or
one in every 100 people 15-49 years old.
There are approximately 18 new
infections per day.




HIV TREATMENT CASCADE

Achieving the 95–95–95 targets to prevent HIV-related deaths, requires that 95% of people living with HIV knowing their HIV status, 95% of people who know their status receiving antiretroviral therapy, and 95% of people on antiretroviral therapy have suppressed viral loads.



PREVENTING MOTHER-TO-CHILD **TRANSMISSION** OF HIV
