Note: The Alex Fraser Park office is open Tuesday's from 2pm – 7pm and Thursday's from 9am – 2pm

<u>Judging</u>

Exhibits are judged on their merit, as well as competitively (in comparison to other entries in that class and age/status category).

Consequently, exhibits in categories where there are no other entries, do not automatically receive first prize. Judges may choose to award more than one of the same prizes in the same class, particularly in large categories.

In sections where exhibits do not meet the judge's standards no prize shall be awarded.

Whenever possible, judges will provide a written evaluation.

General Rules

All general rules apply.

- No more than one entry per class unless otherwise stated.
- Entries must not have been worn or used before exhibiting.
- Entries must not have been exhibited previously at the Quesnel Exhibition and Fair.

• All entries must be the work of the exhibitor. Exhibitors full name, address and telephone number MUST appear on the tags.

- Tags will be provided for all online entries.
- All exhibitors in adult classes and division must be 13 years of age and older.
- All entry forms must be submitted no later than Friday, September 9th by 5pm.
- NOLATEENTRIES ACCEPTED.
- Exhibits removed before the deadline will forfeit all prizes and may be barred from future competition.
- All exhibits MUST be picked up between 3:30 and 4:00 pm on Sunday, September 11th, 2022.
- Exhibits not claimed will become the property of the Quesnel Exhibition & Fair.
- Use only one staple to close your entry tag. DO NOT use tape.
- No cross entries within the children section.

PLEASE HAVE ALL EXHIBITS SUBMITTED BY 5:00PM FRIDAY, September 9th, 2022.

Note: Exhibits will be displayed in the Alex Fraser Agriculture Event Centre (indoors).

Amateur Status except when otherwise stated

Only amateurs may enter their work in this show for contests or competitions.

For the purpose of this show, an 'amateur' is defined as: One who engages in a craft or growing endeavor as a pastime or hobby and not as a profession or livelihood or with the intent of realizing profit.

For the purpose of this show, the term amateur includes:

- those whose work is not their main source of income.
- those who do not own, in whole or in part or have any interest in a commercial outlet for their craft.
- those who do not teach or otherwise provide instruction in their craft for remuneration.
- those who are not employed in a profession pertaining to their craft.
- those who do not compete as a professional in other shows pertaining to their craft.

The Quesnel Agricultural & Exhibition Association reserves the right to refuse/refund entry from anyone who in the opinion of the Association is not an amateur; and the Association reserves the right to disqualify and remove from display at the show, the work of anyone who is not an amateur. Exhibitors must indicate their amateur status by signing their name in the space proved on the entry form.

Vegetable Guidelines

How to Prepare Your Vegetable Entries

Beans- Trim stems to¹/2" Beets – Trim tops to 1": leave roots intact Broccoli - Bunches should be trimmed to approximately 7" in length Brussels Sprouts - Remove loose outer leaves Cabbage - Trim stalk, leaving one or two of the outer leaves on Carrots - Trim tops to 1/2"; leave roots intact Cauliflower - Remove stalk and large leaves. Trim off remaining leaves just below the level of the curd. Corn – Remove 1/3" of the husk, length wise, trim shank to1/2" Kale - Remove roots Kohlrabi-Trim roots and leaf stems close to the bulb. Leeks – shorten roots to ½", trim tops. Lettuce-Remove roots and small or damaged outside leaves.

Onions - Trim roots and tops to 1/2 "; remove only the dirty outer scales, do not wash **Parsnips**– Trimtopsto¹/₂"; root tips may be shortened Peppers - Leave stems on Potatoes-No greening or scabs. Do not wash, just brush off the dry soil Pumpkins - Leave stems on. Radishes - should be bunched with tops and roots left intact Shallots - remove tops and roots Squash – Leave stems on Swiss Chard- Remove roots Tomatoes- Leave stems on Turnips – Trim tops to ½", remove tap root just below the body of the turnip

Judging Criteria

Vegetable entries will be judged on:

- · Size specimens should be of good average size for the variety
- Colour specimens should be of bright, clear, and attractive.
- Appearance specimens should be free of pests, blemishes, diseases, dirt, and damage.

Rules

The following rules apply to this category:

- 1. All exhibitors must enter under amateur name
- 2. All Exhibitors must be 13 years or older
- 3. Only one entry per variety per class permitted

4. Vegetables must be correctly named in variety or points will be lost. Exhibitor is responsible for adding entry tags when they are attached to exhibit

5. All fruit, field crops and vegetables will be judged according to the Standards of Perfection as issued by the ministry of Agriculture

6. All special prizes subject to sponsor variety names to participation

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GENERAL STANDARDS OF JUDGING

Flower entries will be judged including:

- Form uniformity, proper maturity(not over or under mature).
- Proper shape(not misshapen).
- Proper petal-age.
- Stems & Foliage- uniformity, strength &/or straightness, foliage quality, size & proportion.
- Colour–uniformity, intensity, clarity & brilliance.
- Size uniformity, proper size for variety.
- · Condition uniformity, substance(turgidity), freedom from bruise & blemish
- Spike, a thick upright stem carrying several blossoms.
- Spray, a specimen with leaves, branches & buds off all size shoots
- Bloom, take only the stem the blossoms are on, leaving off all side shoots.

Please place all baking on disposable plates or containers & covers with a plastic bag Ziploc type is preferred. You may use paper, plastic or foil plates or trays.

Please remove cakes from pan & mount on a firm base. A piece of heavy-duty cardboard with foil makes a good base.

Part of judging is based on appearance. The more carefully you package your entry, the easier it is for conveners & judges to do their job while still maintaining the appearance of your entry. All Exhibitors must be 13 years or older.

JUDGING CRITERIA FOR BAKING

Yeast breads – should have smooth rounded top, evenly brown, thin crust, moist interior. Fine, even interior texture,

light pleasant taste and pleasant aroma.

Baking powder biscuits – should have fairly smooth surface, delicately browned, tender- crisp crust with a slightly

moist interior, flaky and tender, pleasant Flavour.

Quick breads & muffins – should be lightly browned, symmetrical, bumpy, rough surface, tiny holes, not tunnels Cakes- should have a flat or slightly rounded top, moist, fine grained, slightly glossy surface, fine grained, slightly glossy

surface, fine velvety texture. Does not crumble significantly when cut, is tender. Has a characteristic, pleasant flavor.
