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Zechariah's name means "one whom [Yahweh] remembers." He is both priest and prophet and encourages the people by painting a detailed picture of their hopeful future by comparing with the current destruction of the temple.

Zechariah was "a contemporary of Haggai the prophet, Zerubbabel, and Joshua, the high priest." The book is in the genre known as apocalyptic. This kind of literature "was meant to offer hope to a down cast people through describing the ultimate defeat of evil and victory of God for His people. In some ways apocalyptic literature is like parables in that it is meant to reveal and hide truth. Ezekiel calls his apocalyptic material parables".

When we see change, something unfamiliar, or destruction, it's hard to believe that God can redeem the situation and create beauty. God spoke to his people and encouraged them that there would be life again. He said that people would grow to be old again (v. 4) and the streets would be safe for children to play in again (v. 5). God reminds the listeners that he will be faithful and just, and that he calls the people his own (v. 8). Our minds and hearts sometimes struggle to see past what our eyes see. Frequent reminders that God is still on the throne and has our best interest in mind are helpful.

Giving ourselves time to adjust to our new normal is hard, but growth and production take time. Zechariah 8:12 mentions seeds growing well, vines yielding fruit, crop production, and rainy seasons—all of which take time. Sometimes we need to simply wait and allow ourselves to adjust.

God identifies us as "the remnant," an unfamiliar term to many. One lexicon defines it as "remaining part, survivors, especially after a slaughter". The concept of remnant can also be found in the Greek New Testament in Romans 11:5 [So too at the present time there is a remnant, chosen by grace.].

"Within a shrouded New Zealand forest, a tree stump keeps itself alive by holding onto the roots of its neighboring trees, exchanging water and resources through the grafted root system." Though the remnant stump appears dead, a grafting of roots underground connect the part that looks dead to the healthy trees. During times of significant change or stress, we can find solace and sustenance by remaining connected to the body of Christ. Just as Zechariah's name means "one whom [Yahweh] remembers," so we are known by God and supported through his people. It's wise to develop these roots (or maintain them) or connections to other people before times of stress occur.

[Some questions to think about:]

*What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?

*Consider how an apple tree farmer grafts his young trees to an established tree. How has God grafted us into his family?

*What are you hopeful for in your future or your family's future?
