FINDING NEW PLACE OF LIFE

Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it." So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. Acts 8:29-30

Philip, one of the seven early church leaders selected help meet the practical needs of the Greek-speaking members of the church (Acts 6:1–6), was also a fruitful preacher (8:5–8), and an angel gave him specific instructions to go to a place where the Holy Spirit was already at work. Because he was already knowledgeable in the Scriptures, he was prepared for the task ahead. Philip immediately obeyed and encountered an important Ethiopian. Philip, the pastor-turned-missionary, used what the official was reading as a starting place to explain the good news of Jesus. The result was the conversion and baptism of a new Christian (vv. 26–39).

The meeting between the Ethiopian eunuch and Philip occurred in the early era of the church, not long after the coming of the Holy Spirit. The passion and power provided to those present on that meaningful, church-history-shaping day fueled the expansion of the church. "According to church tradition, this man [the Ethiopian official] was to become an evangelist among his own people". Phillip's obedience produced the man whom "some ancients viewed as the father of evangelism in Ethiopia".

Philip had a sudden "new normal": a new location for ministry. But he was ready and available for whatever the circumstances were going to be, and he relied on the Holy Spirit to lead. Faithfulness in our sudden life changes depends on our behind-the-scenes preparation of practicing spiritual disciplines and building muscles of faith (1 Timothy 4:7–10).

All Scriptures are applicable to our situations, our thoughts, and our futures—including the Old Testament. Philip knew the Old Testament and was able to apply it when needed. "We meet the same God in the Old Testament as we do in the New Testament".

Spiritual disciplines that help prepare us for a new normal or sudden change include Bible reading, meditating on Scripture, prayer, discipleship, and gathering with other believers for community and edification.

"Hang in there and hope" was Stephen Bradbury's strategy when competing for an Olympic gold medal in 2002: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=vN7ih576VYM. Do we have the same kind of tenacity and availability to God in our spiritual life? Are we presenting ourselves to God, willing for him to use us wherever he leads us?

- What new spiritual discipline could you use to help you prepare for serving the Lord in the future?
- How did knowing God's Word thoroughly help Philip prepare? What can we learn from that?
