Mobster receives Award, Bowling Green, Kentucky

On September 5th, Mobsters Terry & Jennifer Anderson and family traveled to the Beach Bend Raceway located in Bowling Green Kentucky for the LTX Shootout 2020. This is a national event that brings all LT engine car owners out for drag racing with individuals competing in specific classes.



Terry brought his 1988 Firebird (formerly mine, V6 manual) for competition. In 2013, Terry replaced the V6 with the LT1 motor. He spent much time researching this motor – his goal was to install a motor that would be competitive on the dragstrip and also suitable for every day driving. In his research, he conversed with Hawks Motorsports located in Easley South Carolina who installs these motors and confirmed that the LT1 would “fit the bill” in reaching his goal. Hence, the V6 was replaced.



After time, options would be added to the car (line lock, shift light, nitrous) to make it more competitive on the dragstrip. Now the fun begins! Drag race ready and he still has his everyday driver.

Terry registered at the Shootout in the “True Street Class”. In this class, all cars were required to take a 30 minute drive thru town and when on return back to the dragstrip make 3 passes back to back. The competition portion between drivers was “index” based. The winner would be the one whom when the 3 passes were ET averaged, came closest to the following index: 9.0, 10.0, 11.0, 12.0, 13.0, 14.0, and 15.0. Terry’s average was 11.991 making him only .009 away from his 12.0 index. Way to go Terry! Needless to say, he and his family were ecstatic! During that evening’s award ceremony, Terry was given a trophy along with a cash purse of which he was unaware would be given. Another shocker!



Yes, a Firebird is not a Mopar, but a Brand X is welcome into the club. Only needed is the love of old cars and support the MOB. Terry helps during the Swap Meet and also supports me with my '66 Charger. Actually, hopefully in the NOT so distant future, he will have my Charger. And what will he replace the 318 with??? The 33rd Annual Sunshine State All Mopar Show and Swap Meet featuring Mopars with Herb McCandless (aka Mr.4-Speed) hosted by the Florida Mopar Association will be held on November 13, 14 & 15, 2020 at the Florida Agriculture Center and Horse Park, 11851 SW 16th Ave.

(Hwy 475A--take I-75 exit 341 and go east to first left at light--the entrance is 1.7 miles on right at the Florida Horse Park sign) Ocala, Florida.

Again, this year we are hosting a Mopar Welcome party on Friday night, November 13 from 6 to 10 PM for \$25 per person including a Big Easy Cajun dinner (plus other food), wine & beer, a live band and dancing.

This year we will be giving away \$500 on both Saturday and Sunday (\$100 each hour) based on ticket drawings--tickets are free with your registration. Also, the Park entry road has been paved and we will be parking the first 200 vehicles to enter under the main pavilion.
