The monthly meeting of the McKinley Community Health Alliance convened to review the Community Health Impact Assessment completed & published by the MCHA HIA/Housing Justice Team (https://mckinleyhealthalliance.org/community-health-data). The meeting concluded with our regular partners updates & announcements, openly made by those present and in the chat log.

MCHA Meeting 3/8/23 Notes

- 1. Housing Health Impact assessment
 - 1. There were consistent findings that housing is a huge determinant of health, as well as wealth disparities.
 - 2. While performing the assessment they reached out to organizations that previously did HIA's
 - 3. This assessment was performed on ancestral native lands of the Zuni, Dine, and Hopi
 - 4. Pandemic complicated matters, but we were able to hire 3 interns due to the assessment.

2. Recommendations from the assessment

- 1. The city and county should adopt the housing first model as policy.
- 2. The city and county should jointly fund a position for a housing coordinator.
- 1. The city has hired a housing and economic development coordinator, though she is the only one in her department so far.

3. Follow up

- 1. The Housing Justice team meets every 2 weeks, 3pm on Thursday.
- 2. MCHA received a grant for 25k last year and 100k is expected this year and next year.
- 3. As part of that, MCHA has sent out letters to a couple organizations for 4k donations.

4. Observations

- 1. The mix of different land jurisdictions and zoning is causing land lock and making it hard for different communities to get housing.
- 2. Housing market analysis highlighted the disparities in availability, cost and development.
- 3. Many are overburdened (>30% of income) by rent in NM.
- 4. COVID spread easier in homeless communities due to lack of resources.
- 5. The analysis also highlighted aspects of structural racism and effects of multigenerational trauma.
- 6. Determinants of more positive outcomes included economic safety, good childhood education, and feeling safe.

5. Methodology

- 1. Surveys at Rio West Mall found that older Dine people mostly only understood spoken Dine. Next time consider the option for oral surveys.
- 2. We did focus groups at NCI and a couple other locations.
- 3. The literature review had data only up to 2020, so the numbers may have changed some.

6. Data

- 1. Most of Gallup property is utilized for rentals versus house ownership and rentals have a high percentage of overburdened by rent individuals.
- 2. Most of the children living in poverty are on the north side and downtown. Similar stats in adults.
- 3. Elderly in poverty mostly in the north side as well, with a large percent in east and downtown sections.
- 7. Next steps involve advocating for recommended changes and utilizing the grant awarded to MCHA
- 8. Questions and comments

- 1. What is causing the housing problems? There are just no resources at all levels. We have a little emergency shelter but even those often have waitlists. There is little to no case management, or housing retainment support in the general housing market.
- 2. Comment North end held a lot of mining workers and railroad workers, and thus abandoned mines historically decreased outcomes.
- 3. Gamerco was not included in the assessment, but it has its own health consequences from mining. It's looking to expand distribution centers there and reopening mines but health considerations are not being examined.

9. Updates

- 1. MCHA -CHIP plan, hiring another couple interns. Advocating for funding health councils, all get about 10k for operations, the 120k funding was tabled because 'we didn't do stuff right'. Relationships with the dept of health may be changing. trying to request proper funding for health councils. Stipends for core members
- 2. Bee Update on eye associates. Dr Hillams is going to come to eye associates twice a month starting in April. Dr. Hilliam, Orchard Eye Group, 801-658-5486
