St. John Ladies Aid 100 years old: St. John Ladies Aid charter date December 15th, 1915, by Rev. J Nau. Minutes were written in German until 1932, there were 45 members. Some things the Ladies Aid did over the years, 1932 painted and varnished woodwork and walls. Henry Gums did this for \$160.00 dollars, including paint and second cost of paint for \$55.00. In May bought electric candles for the Church. December project sent chickens to Bethesda Lutheran home in Watertown. Gave Rev. Nau Christmas gift of \$10.00, he gave

\$5.00 back. In 1933 the Ladies Aid bought a cord of wood for \$15.00. March 1934, sent 115 dozen eggs to Concordia College for \$1.65 in Milwaukee. June 1934 loaned Walther League for \$50.00 for 11/2 years at 3% interest to complete their beautification project.

Loaned them \$35.00 for a total of \$85.00. July 1st,

1934, Special meeting to buy

5 gallons of ice cream and a quarter barrel of beer for picnic for which they took a collection. Bought tar paper for the floor in the meeting room at school and a cook stove. German and English was read by Pastor Nau at meetings and Bible Study. LWML project sent 8 boxes of clothes to orphanages in Finland and Germany. In 1948 installed linen closet and tiling in the parsonage. Sent dish towels to Camp Luther. Purchased a water pail and dipper to be used by societies. They had a white elephant sale which made \$96.00. In 1948 balance on hand was \$1418.59. In 1944 the church had 23 boys in the military and they sent gifts. In 1952 Ladies Aid paid for a new organ & dishes for new Church. In 1954 ladies were exempt from serving, they could serve if they wish to. In 1953 Mrs. Harold Zimmermann donated a gas range to the Ladies Aid. In 1952 they had a rally, menu was noodle chicken bake dish, 309 chickens, 16 heads of cabbage, each member brought a cake, 24 dozen rolls, jelly carrot sticks and pickles. September 1953 served a chicken dinner with dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy, carrots, cabbage salad, sliced tomatoes, rolls, nut bread, apple pie, cheese, coffee & milk, \$1.50 for adults, .75 for 6-14 year olds, .25 for small children. 1963-64 they bought desks for teacher and children at school. For their 40th anniversary they had a catered meal for \$1.50 per person, Hildegard Schoesau made it. Walther League served and cleaned up. Pastor Nau was the guest speaker. In 1971 bought a file cabinet, carpet for Church and isles for \$2200.00. In 1972 they bought 2 new stoves for the kitchen and shrubs for in the front of Church.
