PROPER POSTING

As your handicap chairman part of my responsibility is to review the weekly scores posted after our weekly Tuesday tournaments. Since we have added many new members last year, a couple of observations and reminders are in order along with a simple recommendation.

When playing on our Tuesday rounds, along with any rounds you play outside the club, each member is responsible for posting their own score.

The biggest discrepancy I see from the Tuesday game is players not posting the correct "Net Double Bogey Adjustment". They are not considering any holes which may have exceeded net double bogey for handicap purposes. Another common error is posting on another day but not correcting the date played.

In a recent week, I took a look at the scores posted. We had 30 players. Of the 30 players, 4 did not post their scores at all. 14 players posted their total score using the front nine and back nine totals. Of those that posted, 7 posted incorrectly not making the proper adjustment to their score. The remaining 12 players posted using the Hole-By-Hole method. We had one player post his score twice.

Three players posted their scores with the wrong date in which they would have missed out on having a PCC Adjustment because the course played harder on the day we played vs the following day. This is like penalizing yourself since there was no PCC adjustment the following day. When you post on the

GHIN App, it defaults to today's date as the "Date Played". You need to change the date to the proper **day you played**, otherwise you may miss out on a PCC Adjustment that may benefit you for playing in conditions that make the course play harder.

In essence, we had a 44% of the players that did not post properly or did not post at all. It seems we can do better than that. I know "It is just golf" but we want a level field between all players.

The easiest way to handle these issues is to utilize the **GHIN** app and post your score **"Hole-By-Hole"** after you complete your round. It only takes 2 minutes to post your score with this method. You enter your gross score for each hole, the app will automatically advance to the next hole where you enter your score for that hole. Also, it will adjust for any hole where you exceed "Net Double Bogey". You do not have to figure it out yourself.

Try it once and I think you will agree how easy this method is and the most accurate way to post. Of course, you always have the option to adjust manually and post your total score. Quite honestly, most of the Tuesday gang has found that posting hole by hole is really easy. ARE YOU FEELING ECLECTIC?

Not sure or not sure what it means?

Eclectic: deriving ideas, style, or taste from a broad and diverse range of sources.

Sounds cool, but you probably have no idea why I ask or what it has to do with golf.
Well, eclectic is a new game that we are going to play.

Eclectics work this way: Each golfer plays the designated number of rounds. At the conclusion of those rounds, the golfer (or tournament committee) compares his scores on each hole per round. The lowest score made on each hole is recorded for the eclectic, producing one 18-hole score.

I will let you know in advance, but our eclectic game will be played like this:

The first week will be low net, as usual, with the usual payouts, including KP's and skins. The second week, we will again play low net, but using the better score on each hole from either week. So maybe in the second week, you can improve that 8 that you got on the third hole, or maybe not. Either way, you get the better score on the hole. KP's and skins do not carryover even if your skin worthy score does.

If you miss the first week, you can still throw your best low net in the mix. However, if you played the first week, be prepared for some pressure when you try to improve on each hole's score. You may find yourself feeling eclectic, if things go

well, or as the same old sorry ass golfer that you are, if things go wrong. In either event, it's a fun game to try and find your eclecticity.
